## For Health Care Providers

### Childhood, Adolescent, and Adult Immunization Schedules

Provide the most current immunization schedules for the complete complement of recommended vaccines for each age group.

### Vaccine Information Statements

Provide information for consumers on individual vaccines and are required, by law, to be given to patients prior to vaccination.

### Epidemiology and Prevention of Vaccine-Preventable Diseases (The Pink Book)

Presents a comprehensive discussion of vaccine-preventable diseases and immunization in text book format.

### Guide to Contraindications to Childhood Vaccinations

Provides an excellent reference for contraindications and recommended actions for each of the vaccines in the pre-adolescent schedule.

### Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) Statements

Present recommendations from a committee of experts selected by the secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) to provide advice and guidance on vaccine-preventable diseases.

### Training and Education Materials

Provide CME/CNE-approved videotapes of immunization satellite programs, self-study products, on-site courses, and Web-based courses.

## For the General Public

### Childhood, Adolescent, and Adult Immunization Schedules

Provide easy-reference charts showing which vaccines are recommended for children and for adults.

### Parents' Guide to Childhood Immunizations

Provides information on immunization and the diseases the vaccines prevent.

### Immunization of Adults

Provides information on diseases adult vaccines can prevent, tells which adults should and should not be vaccinated, and outlines vaccine safety issues.

### Travelers' Health Information

Provides the latest news on international disease outbreaks and vaccine advisements for specific geographic areas.

### Guidelines for Vaccinating Pregnant Women

Provides information in English and Spanish on which vaccines can and should be given during pregnancy.

### Protect Your Baby with Hep-B Shots

Provides information on hepatitis B, including the symptoms, how it is contracted, pregnancy issues, and vaccine protection.
