Meeting Overview

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency wishes to work with Tribes to develop the Tribal New Source Rule (NSR) to address significant regulatory gaps in the protection of air quality in Indian Country. This rule may affect businesses located in Indian Country and may affect Tribal governments and communities.

The Tribal NSR rule will address minor sources of air pollution. Minor sources could be new businesses or existing businesses that are making changes in equipment or operation that would result in small increases in emissions. Collectively, these may be a significant source of air quality problems in Indian Country.

Examples of minor sources include

- gasoline stations,
- dry cleaners,
- spray paint operations, and
- automotive repair shops.

The EPA is considering the utility of a Federal plan to implement NSR rules versus the creation of a model rule. In weighing these alternatives, the EPA will address economic as well as implementation issues.

The EPA's goal is to reach as many Tribes as possible. This includes soliciting comments from tribal representatives at the four national meetings posted in this announcement.

All four meetings will cover the same topics (see tentative agenda). If you wish to participate in this process, you only need to attend one of the four meetings being held.
