You want the best of everything for your kids, including the best health. Immunizations help keep kids safe from disease. So getting immunizations is important, but figuring out what vaccines to get and when to get them can be difficult.

CDC's National Immunization Program web site does the work for you. You just type your child's birth date and click. You get an instant list of recommended childhood vaccinations and dates to get them. And you do it with your privacy protected—no information about you or your child is recorded or stored.
