SCHEDULE OF PROPOSED ACTIONS

The attached is the Schedule of Proposed Actions (SOPA) for the Rio Grande National Forest and San Luis Resource Area. The schedule includes project proposals that we currently anticipate working on during the summer/fall of 2002.

This schedule is not a NEPA document, nor is it a solicitation for comments. Comments addressed to the schedule do not provide standing for appeal purposes. The purpose of the Schedule of Proposed Actions is to provide you with information on whom to contact should you wish to become involved through site-specific comments. This only provides enough information to enable you to contact the proper person to become involved in the analysis and decision process on the forest. Comments received by project leaders, including names and addresses of those who comment, will be considered part of the public record on the proposed action and will be available for public inspection. Comments submitted anonymously will be accepted and considered; however, those who submit anonymous comments will not have standing to appeal the subsequent decision under 36 CFR Parts 215 or 217. Additionally, pursuant to 7 CFR 1.27(d), any person may request the agency to withhold a submission from the public record by showing how the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) permits such confidentiality. Persons requesting such confidentiality should be aware that, under the FOIA, confidentiality may be granted in only very limited circumstances, such as to protect trade secrets. The Forest Service will inform, the requestor of the agency's decision regarding the request for confidentiality, and where the request is denied, the agency will return the submission and notify the requester that the comments may be resubmitted with or without name and address within (xx) days.

We welcome your interest and participation. We also encourage your involvement in each project that you are interested in. Your participation is particularly helpful during the early stages of project formulation known as "scoping". It is during the "scoping" process that we define the Purpose and Need for the project, identify issues and define the extent of analysis that is needed. All projects are scoped separately from this SOPA. If you identify a project or projects that you are interested in, please contact the ID Team Leader shown on the schedule and provide project specific comments.

On January 19, 2001, the Chief's Office issued a decision on Appeal #97-13-00-0057 of the Record of Decision for the Rio Grande National Forest Revised Land and Resource Management Plan. Subsequently, the Secretary issued a discretionary review decision of the Chief's appeal decision on March 29, 2001. All Forest decisions on proposed actions must be consistent with the Secretary's review decision. Issuance of a Forest decision will be guided by the Secretary's instructions and public comment.

Programmatic Assessments for Various Recreation Projects

The Revised Rio Grande Land and Resource Management Plan provides management direction, standards and guidelines and desired conditions for the Forest's recreation program

To be consistent with the Forest Plan direction and comply with the current terrestrial species status, the Forest plans to do programmatic assessments and decisions that address:

- 1.) Annual developed recreation site maintenance. Developed recreation sites include campgrounds, picnic areas, trailheads, overlooks and interpretive sites. Annual maintenance work is scheduled during the use season (May-September) in conjunction with the operation of the developed recreation sites.
- 2.) Annual trail maintenance work of existing forest system trails. The forest maintains between 150 to 250 miles of system trails each year. Trail maintenance is defined ad the upkeep of the entire trail facility as needed for its safe, efficient use and maintained to it's original constructed standard. Trails outside wilderness are maintained with a mini-excavator and a couple trail crew personnel.
- 3.) Scheduled Deferred Maintenance Projects. FY02 projects include: (1) Big Meadow Water System; (2) Forest Toilet Replacement (Buffalo Pass CG, Elk Creek CG, Trujillo Meadows Res and Tucker Ponds Fishing Area); (3) Toilet installation at South Fork Guard Station; and (4) Dam repair work at Spectacle Lake. FY03 projects are: (1) Platoro Guard Station Bunkhouse and water system maintenance and (2) Highway Spring well. FY04 projects are: (1) Forest campground water system upgrades (Lake Fork, Lost Trail and POSO Campgrounds); (2) Hansen Mill TH toilet replacement; (3) Love Lake and Jumper Lake Maintenance work, and (4) Creede Office furnace replacement. FY05 projects are: (1) Creede Administrative Site septic system upgrade; (2) Forest campground water system upgrade (Alamosa CG and Big Springs PA), and (3) Forest Toilet Replacement (Spectacle Lake CG and Fern Creek TH).
- 4.) Short Term Special Uses. This assessment will cover a variety of activities (weddings, races, events) that involves occupancy or use of National Forest System Lands of a temporary nature (either 4-8 hours to 1-2 day events) and are consistent with the Forest Plan.
- 5.) Outfitter and Guide Prospectus. This assessment will address the effects of awarding under special use permit additional outfitter and guide activities and service day on the Rio Grande National Forest. The activities include day use and overnight progressive hiking trips, 4 wd tours, fall game hunts, meat packing, limited bear and archery hunts, winter lion hunts, winter mountaineering and snowmobile trips on groomed trails.
- 6.) Winter Use Capacity. Plan amendment tiered to tiered to the Forest Plan capacity allocation process that will establish service days for commercial, institutional and public winter use on the Rio Grande NF.

MILLION FIRE BURNED AREA EMERGENCY IMPLMENTATION: A Team of Rio Grande Forest specialists will be implementing contracts and treatments directed at controlling erosion and sedimentation from the Million Fire area, a fire of 9,000 acres, near Sotuh Fork, Colorado. Project treatments include straw seeding and mulching by helicopter of critical areas. Straw wattles (12 inch diameter straw tubes) will be applied in some areas to control sheet and rill erosion. A diversion above Million Reservoir will be constructed to keep the Reservoir from being impacted. Most of the structures and treatments are located in critical watersheds and have to goal of protecting human safety and property from damaging flood and erosion events.
