Key Concepts/Objectives to Emphasize in Instruction and Learning Activities:

- 1. The Office for Victims of Crime and its role as the lead federal agency for victim issues. (3.2-14)
- 2. Key components of the 1995 Attorney General (AG) Guidelines for Victim and Witness Assistance (emphasizing the role of Federal Victim/Witness Coordinators and the FBI Victim-Witness Assistance Program). (3.2-6 to 3.2-8)
- 3. Seven significant federal initiatives. (3.2-16 to 3.2-20)

Objectives:

- 1. Review and describe significant *AG Guidelines* (which combine the Victim and Witness Protection Act of 1982; the Crime Control Act of 1990; and the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994).
- 2. Describe why the AG Guidelines are necessary.
- 3. Identify challenges in implementing the *AG Guidelines* and discuss whether they are currently applied in students' states.

Description of Activity and Faculty Guidelines:

The instructor provides a PowerPoint overview that highlights the three key concepts/objectives, and leads a full group discussion, focusing on:

- How/if students interact with federal authorities to implement victims' rights and services.
- Key components of the AG Guidelines.
- Any challenges students have faced in implementing the AG Guidelines based upon their experiences.
