KC MAN CONVICTED IN ONE OF THE KC METRO AREA'S LARGEST COCAINE RINGS

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced today that a Kansas City man has been convicted by a federal jury for distributing large quantities of cocaine in the Kansas City area.

Robert L. Abbott, 30, of Kansas City, Mo., was found guilty on Jan. 23, 2003, of participating in a conspiracy responsible for the distribution of nearly 200 kilograms of cocaine in the metropolitan area. He was initially charged with the crime in an indictment returned by a federal grand jury on Oct. 11, 2001.

Abbott was found guilty of both counts of the indictment charging him as a conspirator in the cocaine ring.

Following **Abbott's** trial, Graves said, the jury in U.S. District Court in Kansas City deliberated about 40 minutes before returning the guilty verdict to U.S. District Judge Nanette K. Laughrey, ending a trial that began Jan. 21, 2003.

"This amounts to one of the largest cocaine rings in the region," Graves said. "Abbott was purchasing cocaine for about \$17,000 per kilogram and reselling it for up to \$22,000 per kilogram. When the entire 200 kilograms is considered, **Abbott** had a hand in the distribution of more than \$2 million worth of cocaine in the metropolitan area."

The charges against **Abbott** were included in an indictment containing a total of four counts against five individuals.

Co-defendants **Artis Jones**, 30, **Loren Harris**, 41, and **Donovan C. Law**, Sr., 41, all of Kansas City, have already pleaded guilty to federal charges related to their involvement in the cocaine conspiracy. Co-defendant **Juan Antonio Guevara**, 30, a citizen of Mexico who had

been living in Lee's Summit, Mo., currently is a fugitive from justice.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Lajuana M. Counts and Assistant U.S. Attorney Mike Oliver. It was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
