KCK MAN INDICTED FOR INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE METH

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Kansas City man was indicted by a federal grand jury today on charges of being in possession and intending to distribute methamphetamine.

Angelo A. Campos, 22, of Kansas City, Kan., was charged in an indictment returned by a federal grand jury meeting in Kansas City, Mo.

The federal indictment alleges that on Jan. 9, 2003, **Campos** was in possession of 50 grams or more of methamphetamine, which he intended to distribute.

Graves cautioned that the charge contained in the indictment is simply an accusation, and not evidence of guilt. Evidence supporting the charge must be presented to a federal trial jury, whose duty is to determine guilt or innocence.

The case is being prosecuted by Special Assistant U.S. Attorney Jess Michaelsen. It was investigated by the Kansas City, Mo., Police Department and the Metropolitan Methamphetamine Task Force.
