KC MAN SENTENCED FOR CONSPIRING TO DISTRIBUTE 500 GRAMS OR MORE OF COCAINE

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Kansas City man was sentenced in federal court today for conspiring to distribute cocaine.

Oscar Cantu, 31, of Kansas City, was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Fernando J. Gaitan, Jr., this morning to five years and 10 months in federal prison without parole.

On Dec. 5, 2002, **Cantu** pleaded guilty to three counts contained in an indictment returned by a federal grand jury on Nov. 5, 2002. By pleading guilty, **Cantu** admitted to his role in a conspiracy to distribute 500 grams or more of cocaine between Oct. 8, 2002, and Oct. 23, 2002. **Cantu** also pleaded guilty to two forfeiture counts that require him to forfeit proceeds derived as a result of the federal law violation, which included \$3,000 in cash and a 1996 Ford Explorer.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Candace Cole. It was investigated by the Kansas City, Mo., Police Department and the Metro Methamphetamine Task Force.
