BRANSON MAN PLEADS GUILTY TO METH CONSPIRACY

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced today that a Branson, Mo., man pleaded guilty in federal court to conspiring to distribute methamphetamine in Taney County.

Sean L. Davis, 28, Branson, Mo., pleaded guilty before U.S. District Judge Richard E. Dorr on Sept. 15, 2003, to conspiracy to distriute 500 grams or more of methamphetamine.

By pleading guilty, Graves said, **Davis** admitted that he received supplies of methamphetamine, which he redistributed to others in southwest Missouri.

On June 4, 2003, co-defendant **Howard A. Neustel**, 33, of Kirbyville, Mo., pleaded guilty to his role in the conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine.

As a result of his guilty plea, **Davis** could be subject to a statutory minimum sentence of at least 10 years in federal prison without parole, up to life imprisonemnt, plus a fine up to \$4 million. **Davis'** sentence will be determined according to the United States Sentencing Guidelines. A sentencing hearing will be scheduled after the completion of presentence investigation by the U.S. Probation Office.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Robyn L. McKee. The case was investigated by COMET (the Combined Ozarks Multi-jurisdictional Enforcement Team) and the Branson, Mo., Police Department, with assistance from the sheriff's departments of Taney County and Greene County, Mo., and San Bernardino, Calif., the Santa Barbara Drug TaskForce and the Drug Enforcement Administration.
