BELTON MAN PLEADS GUILTY TO BANK ROBBERY IN CLINTON, MO

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Belton, Mo., man pleaded guilty in federal court today to the armed robbery of a bank in Clinton, Mo.

Thomas Milton Gaugh, 60, pleaded guilty before U.S. Magistrate Judge Robert E. Larsen this afternoon to using a Smith & Wesson revolver to rob the U.S. Bank, located at 115 E. Franklin St. in Clinton.

By pleading guilty, **Gaugh** admitted that he entered the U.S. Bank on Oct. 29, 2002 and announced a robbery. During the robbery, Graves said, **Gaugh** raised his jacket with his right hand causing the teller to believe he was carrying a weapon, and demanded money. **Gaugh** left the bank after stealing \$7,179 in FDIC bank deposits.

Shortly after, however, a law enforcement officer stopped and arrested **Gaugh**, who was driving a silver/blue Toyota Celica. During the arrest, the officer observed the Smith & Wesson revolver lying on the floorboard of the front passenger seat of the vehicle. The officer also recovered a black bag containing the \$7,179 during the arrest.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney William L. Meiners. It was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Missouri State Highway Patrol, the Henry County Sheriff's Office and the Clinton, Mo., Police Department.
