NITRO UPDATE RICHMOND, MO., MAN INDICTED ON FIREARMS CHARGE

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Richmond, Mo., man was indicted by a federal grand jury today for being a felon in possession of a firearm.

David G. Jones, 32, of Richmond, Mo., was charged in a single-count indictment returned by a federal grand jury in Kansas City.

The federal indictment alleges that **Jones** was in possession of a Sturm, Ruger and Company 9 mm caliber pistol on Feb. 9, 2003. Under federal law, Graves explained, it is illegal for anyone who has been convicted of a felony to be in possession of any firearm or ammunition. **Jones** has two 1990 criminal felony convictions for burglary and stealing.

Graves cautioned that the charge contained in the indictment is simply an accusation, and not evidence of guilt. Evidence supporting the charge must be presented to a federal trial jury, whose duty is to determine guilt or innocence.

The case is being prosecuted by Special Assistant U.S. Attorney Jess E. Michaelsen. The case was investigated by the NITRO Task Force and the Ray County, Mo., Sheriff's Department. NITRO is the Northwest Missouri Team Response Operation, a joint law enforcement effort by the United States Attorney's Office and federal, state and local law enforcement agencies in the 16-county region.
