WARRENSBURG MAN SENTENCED FOR POSSESSION OF PIPE BOMBS

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Warrensburg, Mo., man was sentenced in federal court today for possessing two pipe bombs.

Lawrence Wayne Logan, 24, of Warrensburg, Mo., was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Fernando J. Gaitan, Jr., this morning to five years and 11 months in federal prison without parole.

On April 10, 2003, **Logan** pleaded guilty to an indictment returned by a federal grand jury on Nov. 5, 2002. By pleading guilty, Graves said, **Logan** admitted that he placed two pipe bombs in a duffel bag that was seized from the bedroom of his home during the execution of a search warrant by Johnson County, Mo., sheriff's deputies on Oct. 7, 2002. Graves explained that each of the pipe bombs consisted of a length of PVC-type pipe containing black incendiary powder with end caps. Neither of the explosive devices was registered to **Logan** in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney D. Michael Green. The case was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms and the Johnson County, Mo., Sheriff's Department.
