KC, OVERLAND PARK MEN INDICTED FOR CONSPIRING TO DISTRIBUTE 500 GRAMS OR MORE OF COCAINE

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Kansas City man and Overland Park, Kan., man were indicted by a federal grand jury today for conspiring to distribute 500 grams or more of cocaine.

Miguel A. Lomera, 28, of Kansas City, Mo., and **Hilario Jacobo-Bejar**, 33, of Overland Park, Kan., were charged in a four-count indictment returned today by a federal grand jury meeting in Kansas City.

Count One of the federal indictment alleges that **Lomera** and **Jacobo-Bejar** conspired to distribute 500 grams or more of cocaine on July 23, 2003.

Count Two of the federal indictment alleges that **Lomera** and **Jacobo-Bejar** possessed with intent to distribute 500 grams or more of cocaine on July 23, 2003.

Counts Three and Four of the federal indictment allege that **Lomera** distributed cocaine on July 14, 2003, and July 16, 2003.

Graves cautioned that the charges contained in the indictment are simply accusations, and not evidence of guilt. Evidence supporting the charges must be presented to a federal trial jury, whose duty is to determine guilt or innocence.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney David M. Ketchmark. It was investigated by the Kansas City, Mo., Police Department.
