SECOND DEFENDANT CHARGED WITH SMUGGLING ILLEGAL ALIENS

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a second defendant was charged in federal court today with illegally transporting illegal aliens within the United States.

Julio Martinez-Resendiz, 36, a citizen of Mexico, was charged this morning in a criminal complaint filed in U.S. District Court in Springfield. The criminal complaint alleges that **Martinez-Resendiz** illegally transported an illegal alien within the United States by means of a vehicle for the purpose of private financial gain.

In a separate criminal complaint filed on Dec. 8, 2003, **Raul Enriquez**, 27, a citizen of the United States, was also charged with illegally transporting an illegal alien within the United States.

Affidavits filed in support of the criminal complaints state that a Missouri State Highway Patrol trooper stopped a 1998 Chevrolet Suburban for a traffic violation on Dec. 8, 2003. Upon inspecting the vehicle, the affidavit states, a law enforcement officer observed what he believed to be several undocumented aliens in the vehicle.

Enriquez, who was operating the vehicle, and 12 undocumented aliens – including **Martinez-Resendiz** – were then taken into custody. The affidavits allege that **Martinez-Resendiz** arranged for **Enriquez** to transport the undocumented aliens from Phoenix, Ariz., to Florida, and compensated **Enriquez** for driving the vehicle.

Graves cautioned that the charges contained in the complaints are simply accusations, and are not evidence of guilt. Evidence supporting the charges must be presented to a federal trial jury, whose duty is to determine guilt or innocence.

Both cases were investigated by the Missouri State Highway Patrol and the Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement.
