## SECOND KC DEFENDANT SENTENCED FOR INVOLVEMENT IN PCP CONSPIRACY

**KANSAS CITY, Mo.** – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a second co-defendant was sentenced in federal court today for conspiracy to distribute phencyclidine (PCP).

**George A. Richardson**, 29, of Kansas City, Mo., was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Fernando J. Gaitan this morning to six years and three months in federal prison without parole.

On Feb. 18, 2003, **Richardson** pleaded guilty to conspiracy to distribute 100 grams or more of PCP between Oct. 1, 2002, and Nov. 14, 2002. **Richardson** was charged with conspiracy to distribute PCP in an indictment returned by a federal grand jury on Dec. 4, 2002.

**Richardson** is the second co-defendant to plead guilty and be sentenced for his involvement in the conspiracy.

**James E. Carter**, 23, also of Kansas City, was sentenced to five years in federal prison without parole on Feb. 21, 2003. On Jan. 7, 2003, **Carter** pleaded guilty to conspiracy to distribute 100 grams or more of PCP between Oct. 1, 2002, and Nov. 14, 2002.

This case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney David A Barnes. It was investigated by the Kansas City, Mo., Police Department.
