PARKVILLE MAN SENTENCED FOR ATTEMPTED BANK ROBBERY

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Parkville, Mo., man was sentenced in federal court today for attempting to rob Platte Valley Bank in Kansas City-North.

Bradley R. Schad, 40, of Parkville, Mo., was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Scott O. Wright this morning to 12 years and seven months in federal prison without parole.

On Nov. 21, 2002, **Schad** pleaded guilty to an indictment that was returned by a federal grand jury in Kansas City on Nov. 14, 2001.

On March 16, 2000, Graves said, **Schad** presented a note to a teller at the Platte Valley Bank, 6130 N.W. Barry Road, Kansas City, that stated, "Give me the your money, do it fast and quit" (sic). **Schad** placed his hands inside his sweatshirt pocket, but the teller asked him to return the note to determine if "quit" was misspelled, meaning "quiet." Another teller activated the alarm, Graves said, and **Schad** fled before obtaining any money.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney William L. Meiners. The case was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Kansas City, Mo., Police Department.
