#### NITRO UPDATE

## FIRST OF SIX DAVIESS COUNTY RESIDENTS SENTENCED FOR CONSPIRING TO MANUFACTURE METH

**KANSAS CITY, Mo.** – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Daviess County, Mo., resident was sentenced in federal court today for conspiring to manufacture methamphetamine. The sentence, Graves said, is the result of work completed by the NITRO task force.

**Teresa A. Swigert**, 44, of Winston, Mo., was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Nanette K. Laughrey this morning to five years and 10 months in federal prison without parole.

On May 2, 2003, **Swigert** pleaded guilty to her role in a conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine between Aug. 17, 2002, and Nov. 2, 2002.

**Swigert** is the first of six defendants to be sentenced in this case. Five other defendants also have been convicted in the conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine.

Marvin L. Archer, 32, Christie L. Phillips, 33, Billie L. Asher, 31, and James E. Hershberger, 25, all of Gallatin, and Lisa R. Carnahan, 39, of Winston, Mo., each pleaded guilty to their roles in the conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine between Aug. 17, 2002, and Nov. 2, 2002.

As a result of pleading guilty, each defendant faces up to 40 years in federal prison without parole, plus a fine up to \$2 million. Their sentences will be determined according to the United States Sentencing Guidelines. Sentencing hearings will be scheduled after the completion of a presentence investigation by the U.S. Probation Office.

All of the defendants were charged in an indictment returned under seal by a federal grand jury on Jan. 7, 2003, in Kansas City. The indictment was later unsealed and made public

upon the arrests and appearance of several co-defendants.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Jess Michaelsen. The case was investigated by NITRO, the Northwest Missouri Team Response Operation. NITRO is a joint law enforcement effort by the United States Attorney's Office and federal, state and local law enforcement agencies in the 16-county northwest Missouri region. Also involved were the Daviess County Sheriff's Department and the Gallatin, Mo., Police Department.
