MEXICAN NATIONAL RESIDING IN CAMDENTON INDICTED FOR ILLEGALLY RE-ENTERING THE UNITED STATES

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Mexican national residing in Camdenton, Mo., was indicted by a federal grand jury today for illegally re-entering the United States.

Romaldo Viveros-Oritiz, 27, of Camdenton, Mo., was charged in an indictment returned by a federal grand jury meeting today in Jefferson City.

The federal indictment alleges that **Viveros-Oritiz** was found on Sept. 6, 2003, in Camden County, Mo., after having been previously deported from the United States. **Viveros-Oritiz** was deported from the United States on June 24, 2003, at Laredo, Texas.

Graves cautioned that the charge contained in the indictment is simply an accusation, and not evidence of guilt. Evidence supporting the charge must be presented to a federal trial jury, whose duty is to determine guilt or innocence.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Jim Lynn. It was investigated by the Camden County, Mo., Sheriff's Department and the Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement.
