## TWO KC MEN INDICTED IN CRACK COCAINE CONSPIRACY

**KANSAS CITY, Mo.** – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that two Kansas City men were indicted by a federal grand jury today on charges related to a conspiracy to distribute crack cocaine.

**Dale M. Willis**, 39, and **Jerrill A. Green**, 29, both of Kansas City, Mo., were charged in an indictment returned by a federal grand jury meeting in Kansas City.

The federal indictment alleges that **Willis** and **Green** conspired to distribute 50 grams or more of crack cocaine between Dec. 16, 2002 and Jan. 3, 2003.

Graves cautioned that the charges contained in the indictment are simply accusations, and not evidence of guilt. Evidence supporting the charges must be presented to a federal trial jury, whose duty is to determine guilt or innocence.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney W. Brent Powell. It was investigated by the Kansas City, Mo., Police Department.
