CARROLLTON MAN SENTENCED TO NEARLY 20 YEARS ON METH CHARGE

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Todd P. Graves, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Carrollton, Mo., man was sentenced in federal court today for attempting to manufacture methamphetamine.

Orville L. Womack, 52, of Carrollton, Mo., was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Scott O. Wright this afternoon to 19 years and seven months in federal prison without parole. Graves noted that **Womack** was sentenced as a career offender.

On Oct. 31, 2002, **Womack** pleaded guilty to attempting to manufacture five grams or more of methamphetamine at a Blue Springs residence.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Michael S. Oliver. It was investigated by the Jackson County Drug Task Force.
