

41.81 EXHIBIT III DSL-1076, LETTER TO BENEFICIARY OF FIANCEE(E) PETITION

Madame/Sir:

You are informed that a visa petition has been received from the Immigration and Naturalization Service according to your status as a fiancée/fiancee under the provisions of Section 101(a)(15)(K) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, as amended. Please read and follow carefully the instructions below.

FIRST: Fill out in duplicate, but do not sign, the enclosed Forms OF-156 together with the single copy of the supplemental form attached thereto. You may disregard Part I and questions numbered 15 and 31 on Form OF-156. You must answer all questions on the supplemental form.

If you have resided in some other country for 6 months or more since your 16th birthday, fill out and sign the enclosed Form OF-179. **RETURN THESE FORMS TO THIS OFFICE AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE.**

SECOND: Take the action indicated in each paragraph which is checked below. Disregard any unchecked paragraphs.

- Passport.** Obtain a valid passport; if you already have a passport make certain it is still valid.
- Photograph.** Obtain one photograph of yourself, size 37 by 37mm or 1 1/2 by 1 1/2 inches, showing full face view, no head covering, white background, on thin paper. If you marry in the United States, the Immigration and Naturalization Service will also require 2 photographs. Therefore, you may wish to have extra copies made.
- Medical Examination.** Arrange for a medical examination by one of the physicians listed on the enclosed leaflet. Please note that you must pay for such medical examination. A medical examination is also required for each unmarried minor child who will accompany you to the United States.
- Birth Certificate.** Obtain one certified copy of your birth certificate. If you have any children, you must also obtain one certified copy of each child's birth certificate.
- Marriage Certificate.** If you were married previously, obtain one certified copy of your marriage certificate or certificates and one certified copy of the divorce or death certificate to prove dissolution of each of such prior marriages.

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- Police Certificates.** If the police authorities where you now reside and where you have resided for 6 months or longer since your 16th birthday issue certificates of what their records show, obtain a certificate or certificates indicating whether they have a record in your name and, if so, what the record shows. You must also obtain a police certificate for each child over the age of 16 who plans to accompany you.
- Court Records.** If you have been convicted of a crime or other offense, obtain a certified court record covering each offense.
- Evidence of Support.** Obtain evidence which will show that you (and your children, if any, who will accompany you) are not likely to become a public charge while in the United States. The enclosed information sheet, Form OF-167, lists evidence which may be presented to meet this requirement of the law.

THIRD: WHEN YOU HAVE OBTAINED ALL OF THE ITEMS WHICH APPLY TO YOU AS NOTED ABOVE, DATE AND SIGN THIS FORM AND RETURN IT TO US IMMEDIATELY.
