# Highlights of the Conference Report to Accompany H.R. 4837 – Military Construction Appropriations for Fiscal Year 2005

On October 9, 2004, the Conference Report to Accompany H.R. 4837, H. Rept. 108-773, was filed.

# Noteworthy

- The Conference Report includes \$11.6 billion in emergency supplemental aid to provide relief from Hurricanes Charley, Francis, Ivan, and Jeanne. Included in this funding is \$6.5 billion for FEMA; \$1.1 billion for Department of Defense costs associated with evacuation and recovery; \$1.3 billion for emergency highway relief; and other relief.
- The Conference Report includes \$2.8 billion in emergency supplemental drought assistance, which is offset by a reduction in the Conservation Security Program.
- The Conference Report provides \$10.003 billion in new budget authority, which is \$450 million above the Administration's request, and \$687 million above the FY04 enacted level.
- The Conference Report provides \$5.5 billion for military construction for the active and reserve component accounts, which is \$636 million above the Administration's request, and \$203 million above the FY04 enacted level.
- The Conference Report provides \$4.1 billion for family housing construction, operations and maintenance, and the Department's family housing improvement fund.
- On October 9, 2004, the House passed the Conference Report to accompany H.R. 4837 by a vote of 374-0.

# **Military Housing Privatization Cap**

The Conference Report to accompany H.R. 4200, the Defense Authorization Act for FY 2005, included a provision that eliminates a statutory cap on the military housing privatization program.

# **Bill Provisions**

# **Military Construction**

The Conference Report provides \$5.5 billion for military construction for the active and reserve component accounts.

#### Active Components:

**Conference Report**: Provides \$4.52 billion for the Active Duty construction.

- Provides \$2.0 billion for **Army** construction.
- Provides \$1.1 billion for **Navy** construction.
- Provides \$866 million for **Air Force** construction.
- Provides \$686 million for **Defense-wide** construction.

#### **Reserve Components**:

**Conference Report**: Provides \$945 million for Reserve component military construction.

- Provides \$447 million for Army National Guard construction.
- Provides \$243 million for Air National Guard construction.
- Provides \$92.4 million for **Army Reserve** construction.
- Provides \$44.3 million for Naval Reserve construction.
- Provides \$124 million for the Air Force Reserve construction.

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$814.2 million, which is \$194.3 million above the Administration's request, and \$83.8 million above the FY04 enacted level.

#### **Medical Construction Program**:

**Conference Report**: Provides \$193.8 million for 11 projects.

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$187.1 million for 10 projects, an amount which is an increase of \$4.7 million over the Administration's (9-project) request.

#### **Contingency Construction**:

**Conference Report**: Provides \$10 million for the Secretary of Defense "Contingency Construction" account.

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$10 million in accordance with the Administration's request.

# Family Housing

**Conference Report**: Provides \$4.1 billion for family housing construction, operations and maintenance, and the Department's family housing improvement fund.

- Provides \$636 million for **Army** family housing construction. Provides \$928.9 million for **Army** family housing operation and maintenance.
- Provides \$139.1 million for **Navy** family housing construction. Provides \$704.5 million for **Navy** family housing operation and maintenance.
- Provides \$846.9 million for **Air Force** family housing construction. Provides \$856.1 million for **Air Force** family housing operation and maintenance.
- Provides \$49,000 for the **Defense-wide** family housing construction. Provides \$49.5 million for **Defense-wide** family housing operation and maintenance.
- Provides \$2.5 million for the Family Housing Improvement Fund.

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$4.1 billion, which is \$7.7 million below the Administration's request, but \$343.7 million above the FY04 enacted level.

### North Atlantic Treaty Organization

**Conference Report**: Provides \$161 million for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Security Investment Program.

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$165.8 million, which fully funds the Administration's request, and is \$4.5 million above the FY04 enacted level.

### **Chemical Weapons Demilitarization Construction**

**Conference Report**: Provides \$81.9 million for chemical weapons demilitarization construction.

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$81.9 million, which fully funds the Administration's request, but is \$37.9 million below the FY04 enacted level.

### **Base Realignment and Closure Account**

**Conference Report**: Provides \$246.1 million for base realignment and closure account (BRAC) Part IV.

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$246.1 million for base realignment and closure account (BRAC) Part IV, which fully funds the Administration's request, but is \$124.3 million below the FY04 enacted level.

# **Energy Conservation Investment Program**

**Conference Report**: Provides \$50 million for the Energy Conservation Investment Program (ECIP).

**Senate-Passed Bill**: Provided \$60 million, which fully funds the Administration's request.
