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
Students visiting the training ship TS STATE OF MAINE in San Juan.

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In the summer of 2003, the Maritime Administration and the Propeller Club of the United States went into a new partnership reaching out to school children in grades 5-8 to teach young America the necessity of maintaining an adequate American Merchant Marine and to assist in the education of our citizens of tomorrow through the Adopt A Ship Program. No individual pupil is permitted to "adopt" a ship, however a classroom under the supervision of a teacher can adopt a ship.

Contacts are made with a ship's Master and if he/she is agreeable to participation, the vessel is registered in the Program. A pairing of the vessel and a classroom takes place and students are able to begin corresponding with the Master.
