



Torrance, CA November 18-19, 2004 This live course is designed to provide updates on schedules, contraindications, standard immunization practices, vaccine-preventable diseases, and vaccine management and safety.

Goal:

To provide the most current information available in the constantly changing field of immunization.

Objectives:

At the end of the series, participants will be able to:

- Describe the difference between active and passive immunity.
- List two characteristics of live attenuated vaccines.
- List two characteristics of inactivated vaccines.

For each vaccine-preventable disease: (pertussis, haemophilus influenza type b, influenza, measles, rubella, varicella, pneumococcal, polio, hepatitis B, hepatitis A, smallpox, meningococcal disease)

- Describe the disease, including the causative agent.
- List the groups at highest risk.
- Identify those for whom routine immunization is recommended.
- Describe characteristics of the vaccine used to prevent each disease. (Characteristics may include: schedule, contraindications, and/or adverse reactions).
- Discuss current immunization issues.
