

theTQMprojectsinApril.All projectteamsvisitedhadmade significantprogressindeveloping problemstatements, establishing targetsforimprovement, analyzing rootcauses, and deve loping countermeasuresandactionplans.

PhilippinesFieldManagement TrainingProgram(FMTP) participantsfromthemunicipality ofMinalabacrecentlyusedHealthy Plan-*it*[™] (seeannouncementon page4)toselectrabiesasahealth priorityanddevelopa localplanto addressit.Theteamisoneof9 localgovernmentunits participatinginthesecondcohort ofFMTPtrainingaimedat improvingthemanagement competenciesoflocalpublichealth officials.Theteamfounda combinationoffactorscontributed totheproblemofrabies, including petowners' failure to vaccinate dogs,childrenprovokingdogs,and lackofknowledgeoffirstaid measuresfordogbites.

Theteam'sprojecthasheightened communityawarenessaboutthe problemandledtoarevitaliza tion ofthelocalProvincialRabiesTask Force.Newactivitiesundertaken sincetheprojectbeganinclude: increasedeffortstovaccinatepets andinformthepublicaboutthe dangersofrabies, increased surveillancefordogbitesand humanrabiescases, and anew rabieseducationprogramfor schoolchildren.Theteam'sgoalis tovaccinate80% of domestic dogs withinthenextyearandreducethe numbersofstraydogsthrough moreeffectiveanimalcontrol.The teamalsohopestoreducethe numberofhuman rabiescasesby 25% eachyearthrough 2004.

JocelynSongsongwillalso presentanoverviewoftheirnew traininginitiativeattheupcoming regionalSMDPconferencein Manila.


