

Green Bay, Wisconsin

The following profile contains information on demographics, political figures, programs, crime, drug use, drug trafficking, and enforcement statistics.

Demographics

- Population: 101,467 (July 2003 estimate); 102,313 (2000 Census)¹
- Race/Ethnicity (2000 Census): 85.9% white; 1.4% black/African American; 3.3% American Indian/Alaska Native; 3.8% Asian; 0.0% Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander; 3.7% some other race; 2.0% two or more races; 7.1% Hispanic/Latino (of any race)²
- ➢ Green Bay is located in Brown County.³

Crime and Drug-Related Crime

There were 895 adult arrests for Part I offenses in Green Bay during 2002.⁷ This is up from 773 such arrests during 2001.⁸

There were 324 adult arrests for drug possession in Green Bay during 2002.⁹ In 2001, there were 320 such arrests.¹⁰

Drugs

- ▶ There were an estimated 788 injection drug users in Brown County during 2002.¹¹
- Cocaine

Cocaine is readily available in multi-ounce to kilogram quantities in the Green Bay area. $^{12}\,$

Marijuana

Marijuana is readily available in multi-kilogram quantities in the Green Bay area.¹³

- Methamphetamine According to the DEA's Green Bay office, there is limited availability of methamphetamine in the area.¹⁴
- Club Drugs The DEA has reported encounters with GHB in the Green Bay area.¹⁵

Enforcement

As of October 31, 2003, there were 226 full time law enforcement employees working in Green Bay (187 officers and 39 civilians).¹⁶

Trafficking and Seizures

- A recent seizure of 37 pounds of methamphetamine was made from out of state individuals, who were attempting to create a market in the Green Bay area.¹⁷
- During 2002, the Green Bay Police Department Canine Unit was deployed on 60 drug searches. Canine Unit efforts resulted in 31 drug finds during 2002.¹⁸

Courts

➢ Drug Court¹⁹

As of September 2004, there were no drug courts in existence or being planned in Green Bay.

Corrections

As of October 22, 2004, the population at the Green Bay Correctional Institution was 1,070. The facility's capacity is 749.²⁰

Consequences of Use

- There were 32 deaths in Brown County during 2002 in which alcohol was an underlying or contributing cause of death. Other drugs were listed as underlying or contributing causes in 26 deaths.²¹
- During 2002, there were 96 drug-related hospitalizations in Brown County. The patients involved in the drug-related hospitalizations stayed an average of 7.8 days.²²
