
- Professional Engineering Services (PES) 871,

Tool for Section 508 compliance

The Office of Electronic Government and Technology has released the **S**imple **T**ool for **E**rror **P**rioritization for Section 508 compliance. This electronic tool uses the output of Section 508 compliance tools and evaluates the accessibility errors to determine both the severity of the errors and the effort to fix them. In addition, STEP508 provides a metric that can be tracked over time to determine the level of your Web site's conformance to the 508 guidelines.

New system to replace IT Solutions Shop

In 2004, the GSA Federal Technology Service (FTS) will deploy a business systems modernization program called the 3rd Generation System project, or simply "3GS." The focus of the 3GS modernization effort is the design and implementation of an integrated system that supports all FTS business units with common business processes, and to provide a superior level of project and funds management capability in collaboration with our customers and industry partners.

What will 3GS do?

- Provide a single, accurate source of information.
- Standardize and unify operations.
- Allow GSA to manage projects to the level of detail required by the project plan and replace the need for "cuff" records for most processes.
- Automatically generate contracts and open market/task orders from a managed library of Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) clauses and project templates.
- Provide a common workspace to create, manage and share documents among GSA associates, clients and industry partners.

Now, SBC and Qwest, the major telecommunications providers in these cities, are going back to the old "organizational" format for all federal listings in the Blue Pages. GSA customers served by these phone companies will again be working directly with their local GSA Federal Technology Service (FTS) representatives for inclusion in the local phone book.
