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Report Highlights:

The EU's Common Fisheries Policy will likely depress future Portuguese seafood production, but will also generate new opportunities for trade. One of the best prospects is codfish. The U.S. already has a presence in this market: in 2002, it had an estimated ten percent of frozen cod imports and eight percent of wet salted cod. In order to expand sales, however, U.S. cod exporters need to work closely with Portuguese processors to adapt their products to local tastes. 1 USD = 0.97 Euros.

Executive Summary

The European Union's ongoing debate over the future of its fishing fleet has been protracted and heated. Environmentalists say that fishing must be radically reduced in order to preserve remaining fish stocks. Fishermen say that stocks are still adequate and that they cannot afford a long-term ban of fishing.

Regardless of the outcome of this debate, the EU's fish catch seems likely to continue its long-term decline. One of the species hardest hit is cod, once a popular protein source in many EU countries. The total EU catch in 2000 was only 179,000 tons, one of the lowest levels ever recorded. Recent information for 2001 and 2002 suggest that the catch has sunk even lower during the past two years.

Cod is particularly important to the diet of Portugal. Annual per capita consumption of fish is among the highest in the World – about 40 kilograms – and cod makes up half of this amount. Altogether, Portugal consumes over 200,000 tons of cod annually. However, this once major codfish producer now supplies a mere two-to-three percent of the domestic market, leaving the rest of the market to foreign suppliers. Cod imports consist primarily of three products (CY-2001 imports, fresh weight basis, given in brackets): Wet Salted Cod (131,512 MT), Salted Dry Cod (68,612 MT), and Frozen Cod (28,705 MT). The U.S. is a significant supplier of both wet salted and frozen cod; its market share in 2002 is estimated at 10 percent of frozen and 8 percent of wet salted.

Virtually all imported cod is further processed into dry salted cod by Portugese industry. There are about 30 companies which process cod, most of which are federated under the *Associação dos Industriais de Bacalhau* (AIB), located in port city of Aveiro. FAS/Lisbon recently visited this group to discuss the market and its prospects for U.S. cod.

Processors say that the Portuguese market is unusually demanding. Since Portuguese eat a great deal of cod, they have very definite demands for texture and taste. In addition, since the price of cod has climbed steeply in the past decade, the fish has gone from being a cheap source of protein to being a near-luxury item. Consequently, the requirements for quality and appearance have gone up with the price. Consumers now demand cod fillets that are "thick and white."

Processors had a number of comments about U.S. cod. They noted, first of all, that nearly all cod imported from the U.S. comes from Alaska, which has a different species (*Gadus macrocephalus*) than the traditional Atlantic cod (*Gadus morhua*). Processors still have a modest preference for Atlantic cod, and thus are willing to pay a bit more for product from Norway or Iceland. They caution that suppliers of frozen product need to avoid dehydrating cod during processing and shipment: once dehydrated, frozen cod has a gummy texture when thawed. They also caution that wet salted product must be selected carefully to avoid development of a brownish tinge, which is not well received by consumers. Because of perceived quality differences, as well as higher transportation costs, U.S. cod is usually competitive only when it is priced US\$1 per kilo below competing European product.
