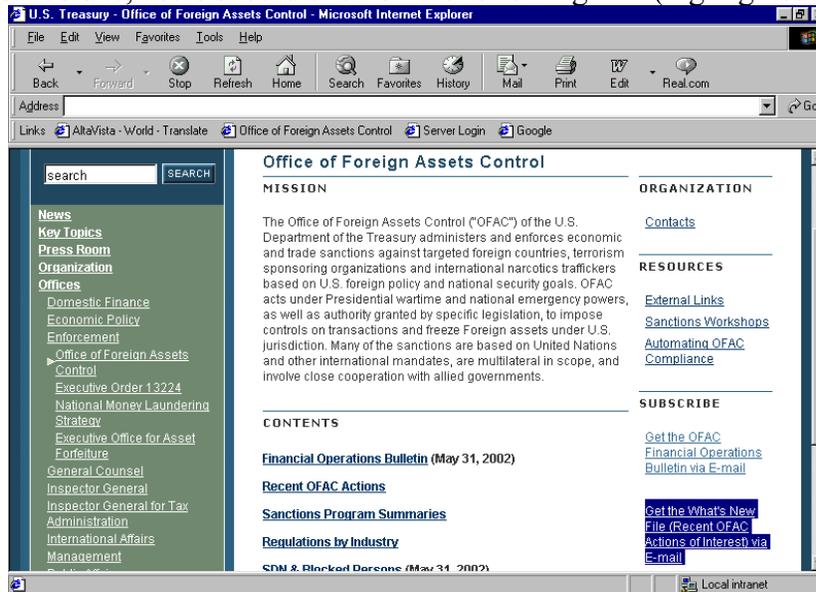


Image of OFAC Homepage

Users can then subscribe to (or unsubscribe from) the OFAC's "What's New" notice by entering relevant information in the page seen below (subscribe.html).

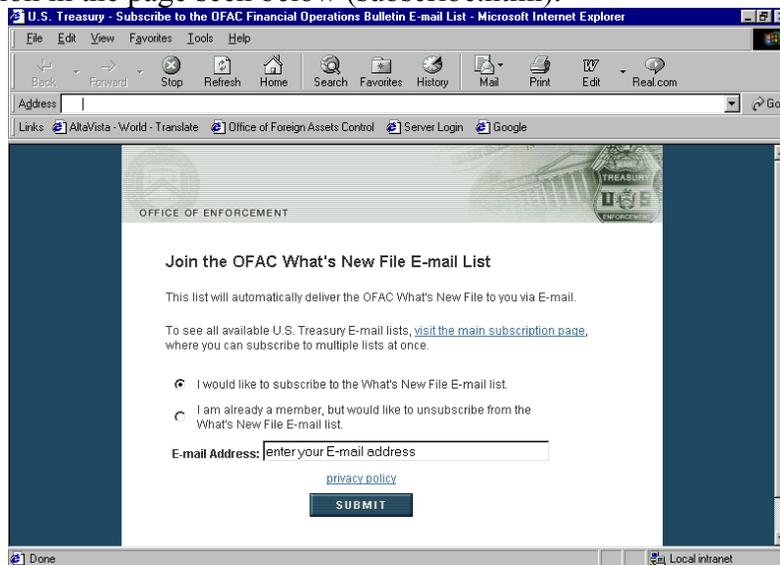


Image of OFAC's e-mail Subscription Page

### **Setting up Microsoft Internet Explorer to Automatically check for OFAC Updates to "What's New" notices:**

1. Access the OFAC page at <http://www.treas.gov/offices/enforcement/ofac/actions/index.html>

2. Click on FAVORITES at the top of the page and add this page to your favorites list (if you haven't done so already).

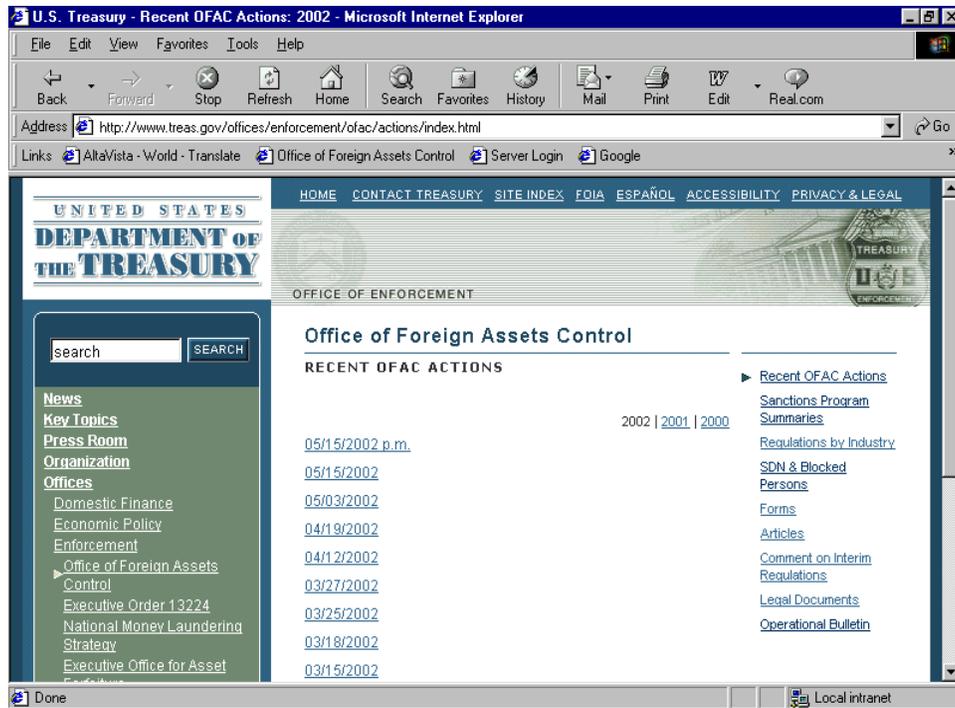


Image of Recent OFAC Actions web page

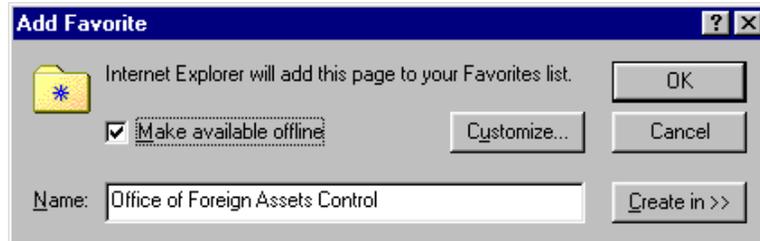


Image of Add Favorite dialogue box

3. Check the "make available offline" box.
4. Click the "customize" button.
5. Scroll through the customization wizard by clicking next until you reach a screen that says, "How would you like to synchronize this page?" Click on "I would like to create a new schedule," and then click the "next" key.



6. The next page will allow you to create a schedule that works for you.



7. While OFAC does not require you to have a password to access its site, you may need to enter a password and login at the next screen if you use a firewall or proxy server to access the Internet. If you are not sure about this option, please check with your systems administrator.



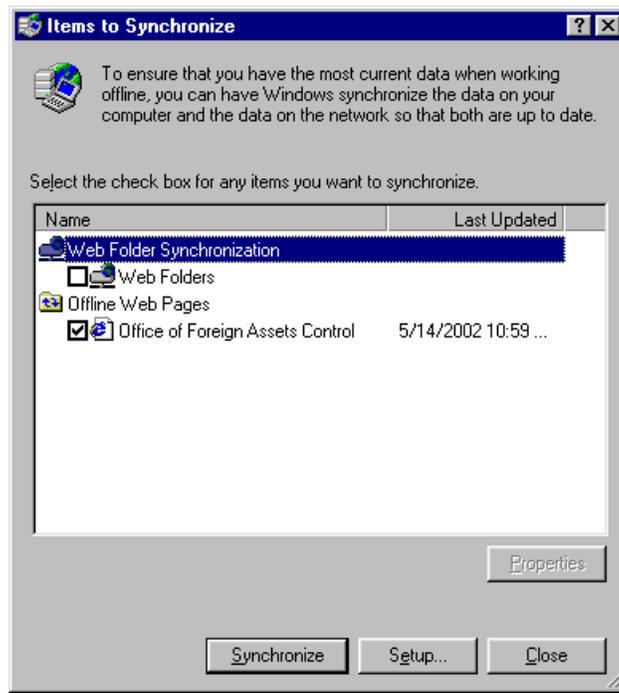
8. Click “finish.” Explorer will now check OFAC’s site for updates based on the schedule you set up. Please consult EXPLORER’s “help” file for more details on the synchronization option.

**Setting your Browser to E-mail you When OFAC Updates Its Recent OFAC Actions Site:**

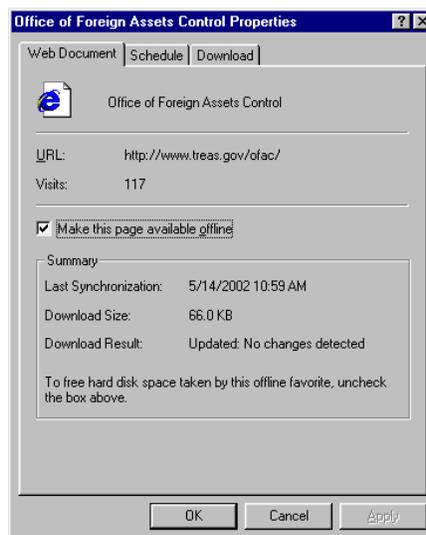
9. Now that you have created a synchronization schedule that works for you, you can configure your browser to inform you when this synchronized web site has changed.
10. On your Browser’s top menu bar click TOOLS, and then “synchronize.”



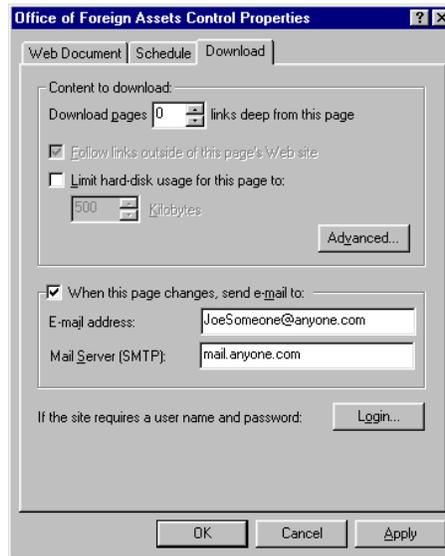
11. Put a check mark next to Office of Foreign Assets Control under “Offline Web pages”



12. Click on the “Properties” button.



13. Click on the “Download” Tab.



14. Click on the check box next to “When this page changes, send e-mail to:”
15. Add your e-mail address and configure your mail server.
16. Click “OK.”
