Office of Environmental Information FY 2003 Environmental Justice Progress Report

1. Introduction and Purpose

The Office of Environmental Information's (OEI) FY 2003 Environmental Justice Progress Report details the activities that supported OEI's long-term goal of integrating environmental justice into its business practices. The Progress Report illustrates OEI's commitment to implementing Administrator Whitman's, Environmental Justice Memorandum, dated August 9, 2001, which states:

... [EPA] has a firm commitment to the issue of environmental justice and its integration into all programs, policies, and activities, consistent with existing environmental laws and their implementing regulations.

The Progress Report is based on the goals established in the OEI's FY 2003 Environmental Justice Plan. OEI's FY 2003 plan is one component of an overall Environmental Justice Action Plan for EPA, and conforms to the Agency template and guidelines for Environmental Justice Action Plans used Agency-wide.

OEI supports the Agency's mission of protecting public health and the environment by integrating high quality environmental information to make it useful for informing decisions, improving information analyses, documenting performance, and measuring success. The office, in consultation with its many different internal and external stakeholders and partners, establishes and oversees information policies and procedures to address the concerns of local, state, and federal government; tribes; the regulated community; interest groups; the general public; and EPA managers and staff. OEI's mission is cross-cutting in nature. That is, it supports virtually all of the Agency's programs through enterprise-wide efforts to improve the way that EPA collects, manages, stores and utilizes environmental information, manages its information technology architecture and makes information technology investments. Consequently, OEI's Progress Report illustrates how we ensured that OEI products address the information and analytical needs of the environmental justice components of Agency programs. During FY 2003 OEI made significant progress in being able to provide EJ awareness in the customization of an EJ awareness to managers and staff, and supporting the information aspect of our Environmental Justice Program and activities throughout the Agency.

2. OEI's Environmental Justice Accomplishments and Activities

In FY 2003 OEI launched its formal Environmental Justice Plan for purposes of guiding its initial environmental justice activities. OEI's plan adopted the following goals:

GOAL #1: Ensure via education and training that all OEI managers and staff understand the concept of environmental justice and have the tools they need to integrate environmental justice into their day-to-day responsibilities.

GOAL #2: Work with the Agency network of Headquarters and Regional Environmental Justice Coordinators and the Office of Environmental Justice to promote the use and further development of electronic tools and information services to support the Agency's Environmental Justice priorities.

Within this goal framework, during FY03, OEI accomplished the following activities:

- Developed Environmental Justice training curriculum for OEI staff and managers; and
- Developed a cutting-edge Environmental Justice Geographic Assessment Tool to conduct environmental justice assessment. This Web-based technology provides access to social, economic, health, and environmental information through the use of geographic layers of information of our nation to address potential or existing environmental justice concerns. It contains numerous information layers that may be utilized by program offices, Regions, and the US public to conduct environmental justice assessments. The tool has the capability to highlight a study area or specific location around a particular EPAregulated facility. This tool was made available on June 2003 on the EPA Intranet and on August 2003 in the Internet on EPA's website. It can be found at <<u>www.epa.gov/enviro/ej</u>>.

The two activities have established a strong foundation for an expanded Environmental Justice program in OEI for future years.
