Reports from the Field

All committee members shared the highlights of the year in their area of responsibility.

Of significance importance are positions in prevention and mitigation that have been recently filled:

Dixie NF – 2 permanent full-time Fire Prevention Education Technicians - Matt Buhler (North Zone) and Wayne Monger (South Zone)

Sawtooth NF – 1 permanent full time Forest Prevention Officer - Rochelle Ahrens (Vice Jeremy Keller).

A mitigation education position has been written and approved for filling as a joint position for Winnemucca and Battle Mountain Field Offices.

Smokey's 60th Birthday Celebration

Smokey will celebrate his 60th on August 9, 2004. A national program is being developed by the Forest Service, the Ad Council, and the National Association of State Foresters. The national campaign will be comprised of PSA's, products – both CFFP items and licensees, messages, and a display for each Region. Events and celebrations will be left up to local areas to design and implement.

A national display is being developed by USA Design for each FS Region. The display will contain a blank panel for each Region to customize their message for the 60th. Once Jeannette receives a visual on the national display, she will get to Tracy, Larry and Jon for them to solicit ideas to design the GB portion. Committee voted to highlight a positive or thank you on our section. We will use a Great Basin calendar to schedule use of the display.

There is $\underline{\$20,000}$ – a one-time gift from the FS/WO - for the Great Basin to celebrate Smokey's 60^{th} . These funds will be divided among the 4 states to assist in local celebrations.

A conference call is scheduled for the GB committee on Tuesday, January 13, 2003, 1000 MST to discuss plans for the 60th. Jeannette will get the dial-in information out.

Fire Prevention Education Teams in the Great Basin

National Fire Prevention Education teams are used to assist local units in accelerated prevention and education efforts when severe situations exist. They are not intended to perform traditional, daily fire prevention or educational activities. This year, the Great Basin hosted 7 National Fire Prevention Education Teams as follows:

Team Leader Course – Salt Lake City, UT – March 8-12, 2004 (must have attended the Team Member Course and participated on national teams)

Team Specialist Course - Missoula, MT - April 5-9, 2004

National Interagency Strategic Plan – The goals of the National Interagency Fire Prevention Education Group are listed below. These are intended as the overall goals and geographic areas should use these as a guide when developing their goals and programs.

Goal I: Reduce Unwanted Human-Caused Fires. (Traditional Fire Prevention)

Goal II: Reduce costs associated with wildfire by increasing the understanding of wildland fire effects. (Fire Ecology and Prevention in the WUI)

Goal III: Develop and maintain an interagency wildfire prevention, education, and mitigation program. (Internal Interagency Education)

Goal IV: Increase the public's knowledge and awareness of wildland fire. (External Public Education)

Goal V: Encourage research and technology transfer from all sources so that fire prevention and fire education programs can be based on the best science, including social science. (Research)

Goal VI: Establish interagency National Fire Prevention and Education Teams (FPET) as a standard National Fire Resource. (Prevention Teams)

Goal VII: Establish Fire Prevention and Education Career Professionals to recognize and promote communication skills. (Career Ladders)

Wildfire Education Working Team (WFEWT) (Chartered Under NWCG) -

Jeannette attended the fall meeting of the WFEWT for Vi Hillman who is the BLM representative on the team.

The following are goals the team is working toward which will aid in our local programs.

- 1. The Team has all the resources it needs to function in an effective manner.
- 2. The public is aware of the role of fire in ecosystems.
- 3. Fire prevention and education teams are fully integrated into the fire organization.
- 4. Team products and services are timely, effective and used.
- 5. Develop and implement a comprehensive system to measure the effectiveness of our mission accomplishment.

Great Basin Prevention/Education Working Committee Three-Year Strategic Plan (2003-2005)

The Plan was reviewed and updated as needed. It was agreed to stay with the current dates of 2003-2005 until next fall when the entire Plan will be reviewed and updated for the next three years. The updated Plan (attached) will be sent to the GBCG.
