KITS, FIRST AID

This amendment forms part of Forest Service Specification 6170-6G, dated September 1995.

PAGE 1

2.1.1: Under federal specifications, delete "U-P-401 - Tape, Adhesive, Surgical".

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3.5.2.3: Delete entire paragraph and substitute:

"Mouth-to-mouth barrier. The mouth-to-mouth barrier shall be a medical device for CPR use listed with the FDA and have current 501(k) number. The barrier shall be of single unit construction and one of two types:

(1) It shall have a 4-1/2 by 4-1/2 inch minimum clear vinyl barrier with an attached breathing tube/bite block measuring 1-1/2 inches -1/16/+1/4 inch, a positive anti-reflux valve, and a barrier that prevents blockage of the valve by a victim's tongue; or (2) it shall have a 5-1/2 by 5-1/2 inch minimum clear vinyl barrier with a 1-1/4 inch minimum viral bacterial filter located in the center of the barrier (see 6.7). Each type shall provide protection from direct contact with bodily fluids. Each mouth-to-mouth barrier shall be packaged in a sealed plastic envelope together with printed instructions."

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3.5.3.2: Delete second sentence and substitute:

"Each bandage shall measure 3 by 1-1/2 inches $\pm 1/16$ inch."

3.5.3.5: Delete third and fourth sentences and substitute:

"This bandage shall come with two safety pins with a minimum length of 1 inch each. 'TRIANGULAR BANDAGE INCLUDING SAFETY PINS' shall be printed on the plastic envelope or on a label included in or affixed to the plastic envelope."

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- 3.5.5: Delete first sentence without replacement.
- 3.5.7: Delete entire paragraph and substitute:

"Cold pack. The cold pack shall consist of a system of plastic bags. The innermost bag shall be breakable and contain as a minimum 45 grams of water. The water bag shall be contained in a bag a minimum 3 mil thick that also contains as a minimum 45 grams of ammonium nitrate. The system shall be sealed with a watertight seal to ensure against leakage. Use instructions and warnings shall be printed on the outer bag. The cold pack shall be packaged in a size 3 paperboard box (see 3.3). "INSTANT COLD PACK" shall appear on both top panel and end panel of box."

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3.5.10: Delete entire paragraph and substitute:

"Calamine lotion. The calamine lotion shall meet the requirements of the United States Pharmacopeia (USP). All ingredients shall be of a pharmaceutical grade and shall be free from defects that detract from its appearance or impair its serviceability. The calamine lotion, USP, shall be packaged in a one-half ounce minimum leakproof squeeze bottle. Production information may be screen printed on the container or printed on a paper label that is affixed to the container (see 3.3.1). Shrink wrapping for a perforated tamper evident seal is required (3.3.2). The calamine lotion shall be packed as specified in 3.5.8."

3.5.11: Delete in its entirety and substitute:

"Insect sting medication unit. The insect sting medication unit shall consist of: (1) a ready-to-use 1/2 fluid ounce (15 ml) aerosol dispenser of epinephrine (5.5 mg/ml minimum) delivering a 0.22 mg (minimum) epinephrine dose per inhalation (see 6.8); and (2) twenty 4-mg tablets of chlorpheniramine maleate. The tablets may be blister packed or packaged individually in either paper or plastic packets. Expiration dating is required on both the epinephrine inhaler and the tablet packaging. inhaler shall have a minimum of 18 months remaining when received from the contractor and the tablets, 24 months. The inhaler and tablets shall be packed as a unit in a size 3 paperboard box (see 3.3); 'INSECT STING MEDICATION' shall be printed on the top panel of the box. 'Insect Sting Medication', a components list, and a unit expiration date that is the expiration date of the component that will expire first (either inhaler or tablets) shall appear on box end panel. Instructions illustrating how to assemble and use the inhaler packaged in the unit box shall appear on the back panel of the unit container. Insect sting instructions (see 3.5.11.1), as illustrated by figure 3, shall be packed in the unit box."

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3.5.19: Delete third sentence and substitute:

"The following items require expiration dating: antiseptic kit, povidone iodine, povidone iodine swabs, aspirin tablets, acetaminophen tablets, eye wash solution, insect medication unit, epinephrine inhaler, and chlorpheniramine maleate tablets."

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Add new paragraphs:

- "3.5.21 <u>Splint</u>. The splint shall be constructed of malleable, radiolucent aluminum having rounded corners and a polyvinyl foam (closed pore) coating. The splint shall measure 4-1/4 inches wide by 36 inches long ± 1 inch in either dimension and weigh 4 ounces ± 1 ounce. It shall be capable of splinting injuries to the arm, wrist, leg, ankle, and neck. The splint shall come from the manufacturer folded flat and sealed in a polybag, measuring no more than 4-1/4 inches by 9-1/2 inches by 1 inch. Use instructions shall be included. Color shall be orange/blue (see 6.7)."
- "3.5.22 <u>Blanket</u>. The blanket shall be constructed from an aluminized polyester film. When unfolded it shall measure a 56 by 84 inches ±1 inch in either dimension. It shall be compactly folded (approximately 2 by 4 by 1-1/2 inches) and sealed in a polybag. Because the blanket shall be used in emergency or rescue situations to prevent post-accident shock or hypothermia, it shall be a Food and Drug Administration registered medical device. The color shall be silver/silver (see 6.7)."

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3.6 <u>Kit contents</u>: Add the following information to TABLE IV. <u>Type IV (belt)</u> <u>kit contents</u> under 'Other Items':

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5.2.1: In the last sentence of paragraph, delete "tamper proof" and substitute "tamper evident".

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Add new paragraphs:

- "6.7 <u>Sources of supply</u>. A splint meeting the requirements specified in 3.5.21 is the Sam Splint available from the Seaberg Co., Inc., P.O. Box 734, South Beach, OR 97366 (541-867-4726). A blanket meeting the requirements specified in 3.5.22 is the Space brand emergency blanket available from MPI Outdoors, 85 Flagship Dr., Suite D, North Andover, MA 01845 (508-685-2700). A mouth-to-mouth barrier meeting the requirements specified in 3.5.2.3 for the type 2 barrier is the Life Mask available from CFT, Inc., 14602 N. Cave Creek Rd., Phoenix, AZ 85022 (800-331-8844)"
- Insect sting inhaler dosages. The epinephrine inhaler that is part of the insect sting medication unit (3.5.11) is intended to reduce bronchospasm that accompany acute allergic or anaphylactic reactions to an insect sting. Such reactions are a life-threatening medical emergency, particularly in a field setting where professional medical assistance is unavailable. This fact underscores the importance of delivering a significant amount of medication to the upper respiratory tract quickly to prevent the onset of such reactions. For this reason, the dosage instructions differ significantly from the supplier's recommended dosages, which are intended for treating shortness of breath and wheezing due to bronchial asthma. Such low dosage levels would not prevent an acute allergic reaction or the onset of anaphylactic shock and therefore would endanger the life of the insect sting victim for that reason. The required marking and instructions included in this specification outline a proper course of action where the intended use for the inhalers is to treat an insect sting victim."
