HIGHWAY FUNDING 1995 - 1998

Date

Total disbursements for highways are expected to exceed \$106 billion in 1998, an increase of 13.4 percent more than 1995, which is the latest year that final numbers are available. Total revenues used for highways or placed in reserves for highways are expected to reach \$109.6 billion in 1998. The difference (\$3.6 billion) will be placed in reserve - \$1.8 billion each for the Federal and State governments.

Total highway-user revenues of \$87.3 billion (motor fuel, motor vehicle taxes and fees and tolls) are anticipated in 1998 which would fund more than 82 percent of all highway disbursements in However, \$10.8 billion of highway-user revenues are destined for collection expenses, general government expenses, and other nonhighway uses, while \$7.7 billion will be used for mass transportation. Consequently, only 79 percent of taxes and fees charged to road users will be applied to the highway programs of Federal, State and local governments. Since more than one-fifth (21%) of highway-user revenues will be expended for nonhighway purposes, governments at all levels must apply a variety of nonuser revenues for highway purposes. Non-user revenue sources include general funds, other specific taxes and fees dedicated to highway purposes, investment income, and bond proceeds. addition, States are employing innovative financing techniques to finance highways, including infrastructure banks. These will play an increasing role in highway finance in the future.

Revenues to the Highway Account of the Federal Highway Trust Fund should total \$22.5 billion in FY 1998. This is \$2 billion more than in FY 1997. Effective October 1, 1997, as a result of the Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 (TRA), the Highway Account of the Federal Highway Trust Fund (HTF) received the proceeds from 3.45 cents of the total 4.3 cents tax per gallon of motor fuel that had previously been dedicated to deficit reduction. The Highway Account also benefits from an increased level of diesel fuel tax collections. This influx of new revenue is expected to cause the balance of the Highway Account to grow from \$9.4 billion in 1995 to \$16.3 billion in 1998. The Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 provides for some delay in the deposit of HTF revenues in FY 1998, otherwise the end-of-year balance would be somewhat higher.

Even though a full year's Federal authorization for FY 1998 has not yet been enacted, highway disbursements are not expected to be significantly effected in 1998. This is due principally to the fact that most current year disbursements result from prior year authorizations. FY 1999 disbursements would, however, be very materially reduced unless Federal re-authorization occurs. Capital expenditures are expected to rise to \$51.3 billion in 1998, accounting for over 48 percent of total highway expenditures. This is an increase of \$7 billion, or 16 percent, compared to 1995. State governments will be responsible for approximately 74 percent of the total, with capital expenditures of \$38.1 billion.

Based upon the latest available data, 30 percent of the State government capital expenditures will be for projects on the Interstate system, and 38 percent will be used on other principal arterials. An additional 22 percent will be for projects on other arterial and collectors, while 10 percent will be used for local roads. Of the amount expended by States on all arterials and collectors, 16 percent is expected to be used for new roads and bridges, 29 percent for other capacity improvements, 46 percent for system preservation, and 9 percent for operational and safety-related improvements.

Total funding for highways including receipts, intergovernmental payments, and disbursements for the years 1995 through 1998 are shown in the attached Table HF-10B.

Projected highway expenditures for 1998 are summarized as follows:
