**S = Security** **Poor** = Violence is ongoing  
**Limited** = Violence is isolated to clearly defined pockets of insecurity  
**Adequate** = Violence has ceased

Security is defined as specific security incidents such as fighting between armed groups, banditry, etc.

**P = Protection** **Poor** = Civilians feel vulnerable at all times and movement is controlled  
**Limited** = Civilians have access to pockets of security and have some freedom of movement  
**Adequate** = In general, civilians feel safe to travel and work; no attempts to control movement

Protection is defined as attacks or threats of attacks against civilians, and involuntary return of IDPs to their home areas

Note: Until an effective ceasefire commission is in place, or the GOS disarms the Jingaweit, security and protection will remain poor.

**A = Access** **Poor** = The affected population cannot be reached by UN assessment teams  
**Limited** = The UN reports that the population can be reached, but access limited due to insecurity and GOS restrictions on access  
**Adequate** = Relief workers can move and work freely among all affected people

Access is defined as the ability of relief agencies to reach affected populations.

**RC = Response Capacity** **Poor** = The affected population receives below full rations of food and no other assistance.  
**Limited** = The affected population receives some food and some other assistance  
**Adequate** = The affected population receives a full food basket, essential non-food items, and has access to clean water and health care.

Response capacity is defined as the ability of relief agencies to provide humanitarian assistance if given adequate access.
