VOTE IN THE NOVEMBER 2nd 2004 U.S. ELECTIONS

Generally, all U.S. citizens 18 years or older who are or will be residing outside the United States during an election period are able to vote

It is easy to register to vote and receive your absentee ballot in Guatemala. Follow these general guidelines:

Visit www.fvap.gov

- To access instructions and registration materials online, visit the federal voting assistance website www.fvap.gov
 - ✓ Refer to the section "Publications and Forms" on the left side of the page
 - Follow the instructions for your state on the "State by State Instructions" link and fill out the Federal Post Card Application (attached to this sheet or available on-line by accessing the "On-line Federal Post Card Application" at www.fvap.gov under "Publications and Forms"). Usually, the last state you lived in is the state you should use for your registration
 - ✓ If you wish to submit the On-line Federal Post Card Application, the Embassy will mail it if you deliver it to us in an addressed, stamped (US 37 cents) envelope.
 - ✓ If you wish to submit the U.S. postage paid Federal Post Card Application, you may request it at the ACS Office, U.S.Embassy (see address below) and return it completed to us for free mailing. Regular Guatemalan mail service will not honor the U.S. Postage Paid!
