2002 ITU WTDC

- March 18-27, 2002 in Istanbul, Turkey
- 1,349 delegates from 153 countries
- 56 telecom regulators



FCC Goals

- 1. Promote implementation of national policies to speed buildout of telecom infrastructure
- 2. Emphasize importance of a well-trained telecom workforce
- 3. Focus on private sector as key to development solutions



Major Achievements

- 1. Adopted US proposal to study domestic enforcement
- 2. Adopted US proposal to study satellite regulation

Role of Private Sector in Development

- Conference renewed the mandate of the Working Group on Private Sector Issues and re-appointed U.S. chairperson
