

# State benefits offered to WTC victims

New Jersey victims of the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks will initially be compensated by the New York State Crime Victims Board (CVB). The New York CVB provides awards for physically injured victims and families of deceased victims of the World Trade Center attack. It also will pay for counseling for those who witnessed the attack or the immediate aftermath and for recovery workers at the scene.

Benefits include:

• Reasonable burial expenses, including memorials;

• Loss of earnings, or loss of support. This is capped at \$600 per week and \$30,000 total:

Medical expenses;

•Counseling for victims and family members;

•Lost or destroyed personal property essential to the health, welfare or safety of the victim, up to \$500 of which \$100 can be for cash. This benefit is limited to those who were personally injured, or those over 60 years of age, under 18 or disabled;

•Rehabilitative occupational training.

The board can issue an emergency award if it appears a victim is eligible and the victim would suffer undue hardship absent the emergency award.

New Jersey Violent Crime Compensation Board (VCCB) workers at the Family Assistance Center in Liberty State Park (exit 14-C off the Turnpike) can assist in making claims. The New Jersey VCCB also uses the New York application to make benefit determinations. These representatives can also help victims apply for compensation for injured survivors, mental health counseling and funeral and medical expenses. New Jersey's VCCB benefits are designed to supplement New York's program once the maximum benefit limits have been reached.
