Call to Order: CAPT Raelene Skerda (rskerda@bop.gov)

- Meeting called to order and last month's meeting minutes accepted with some additional edits.
- RADM John Babb discussed force readiness. Pharmacists in non-clinical duty stations and are not able to achieve their clinical hours can choose another non-clinical role for force readiness.

Section Lead Comments:

- ◆ Administration → LCDR Krista Scardina (<u>scardinak@cder.fda.gov</u>)
 - The recommendations for new PAC members were forwarded to RADM Walling and then to the OSG. The new members will be contacted shortly of their appointment.
 - The revised PAC charter has been signed and is posted on the website.
 - A call for APhA abstracts was sent out on the listserv and the deadline was 16 Oct 2004. PHS will head the Federal caucus again this year at the APhA meeting.
 - Call for nominations for the APhA Federal Pharmacist Award has been out information can be obtained on the APhA web site. Also, delegates will be needed
 for the APhA Annual conference in Orlando, Florida, the end of March. Those
 interested should e-mail their interest to LCDR Greg Davis, the APhA Liaison.
 - LCDR Pincock reported that 3 pharmacists were selected for membership into JOAG and their terms will begin on Oct. 1st. JOAG was invited to a special meeting with VADM Carmona, RADM Babb, and RADM Williams on 08 Sept 2004 to discuss the transformation, the Lewin Group report, and Readiness.
- <u>Recruitment</u>→ CDR James Bresette (<u>james.bresette@ihs.gov</u>)
 - There are currently 900 commissioned officers. The goal of reaching 1000 officers is promising. There was no increase in newly commissioned officers secondary to the relocation of OCCO and no data entry for a two week time period.

- CDR Jane Kreis discussed the requirements and development of a POC reporting feature within the Recruitment Section of the PAC website. The website feature will allow POCs to report on their respective activities, contacts, and coordinate with other POCs. POC's would report and update their school's data on a regular basis. The plan is to go live with the new PAC year.
- Presentation given by CDR Mary Kremzer (FDA) on the Preceptor Program initiated by the FDA, and discussions on expanding and implementing some of the best ideas in our PharmPAC recruitment section/student communications.
- ◆ Career Development → CAPT Jim Imholte (jimholte@osophs.dhhs.gov)
 - LCDR Mark Strong reported that 16.6% of the pharmacy category currently meets basic readiness standards.
 - The CV template was forwarded to the other categories for review.
 - LCDR Mark Strong will follow up on the question of needing dispensing hours to qualify for the pharmacist role in OFRD and report back to the PAC.
 - A suggestion was made for a database of possible 2 week deployment roles for pharmacist stationed in administrative roles. CDR Paul Huntzinger agreed to research developing/coordinating the feasibility of such a database to be shared across agencies.

 - The externship sites on the PAC website is in need to be updated. CDR Paul Huntzinger volunteered to coordinate this effort.
 - New Student Listserv message has been authored and will be on the listserv.
 - CAPT Sharon Gershon reported on the ideas for Pharmacy Week in October, including using Senior Citizen centers/complexes and Community Colleges to better reach populations with needs for pharmacist interventions. Also noted was that materials are available on the APhA web site for pharmacists nationwide to use in celebrating Pharmacist week.
 - Nothing new was to report on the new website proposal.
