## 1981 EUNTING AND FISHING LICENSE SALES CONTINUE TO RISE

Americans wio humted and fished last year spent a record \$455 million on licenses, tags, permits, and stamps according to G. Ray arnett, Assistant Secretary for Fish and Wildiffe and Parks of the Department of Interior.

Total income collected from license sales of all kinds was $\$ 37$ milifon over fiscal year 1980 totals, fnading $\$ 242$ milifon for hunting licenses (up $\$ 20$ million from 1980) and $\$ 213$ million for fishing licenses (up $\$ 17$ million from 1980):

The total qumber of hunting license holders in the United States reported during fiscal year 1981 was $16,638,584-$ up from 1980's total of 16,257,074. Fishing license holders totaled 29,277,241, increasing from 27,994,917 as reported in 1980.

These figures do qot fully reflect the actual numbers of hunters and anglers in the Jnited States. They do not include persons who are exempt from paying a fee for fishing or hunting licenses. In many States, special provisions are made for senfor citizens, persons under 16 years of age, the disabled, and cartain military personnel. Also, most coastal Stares do not require licenses for saltwater fishing. In addition, some people purchase licenses in more than one 5 tate and, therefore, are counted more than once.

Revenues from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses are used by the States to help conduce their fish and wildiffe management and restoration programs. The numbers of license holders in each State are used by the $\mathbb{O} . S . \operatorname{Fish}$ and Wildiffe Service in determining the amount of funds apportioned to the States under the Federal Aid in Fish and Wildiffe Restoration programs. Uuder these programs, States are reimbursed for up to 75 percent of the costs of approved projects undertaken to benefit their fish and wildifferesources. For the current fiscal year which ends September 30, 1982, $\$ 147$ million was apportioned in Federal afd funds for fish and wildiffe conservation.

A State-by-State breakdown of license sales is shown in the attached tables. These figures were compiled by States and provided to the U.S. Fish and Wildiffe Service.
