HONTING AND FISHING LICENSE SALES HOLD STEADY. REVENUES INCREASE

Revenues from hunting and fishing license sales rose 5.6 percent in 1990, John Turner, director of the Interior Department's U.S: Fish and Wildilfe Service, announced today. The total sales of hunting licenses decreased slightly from the previous year while fishing license sales held steady.

A total of $15,806,864$ people purchased hunting licenses during fiscal year 1990, compared with $15,858,063$ in 1989. Fishing license purchasers numbered $30,731,821$ in fiscal year 1990, compared with $30,302,244$ in 1989. Income from the sale of licenses and associated permits, tags, and stamps in 1990 reached an overall total of $\$ 784$ million, compared with $\$ 740$ million in 1989.

In making the announcement, Turner said, "Nearly 50 million Americans enj̣oyed hunting and fishing activities last year. These sportsmen and -women, through the purchase of licenses, Eags, and stamps, provided vital funding to enhance outdoor recreation opportunities for all Americans."

Hunting and fishing are two of the activities highlighted in the Interior Department's recently announced outdoor recreation initiative, "Enjoy Outdoors America."
"Interior Secretary Lujan and I recognize the valuable contributions of our hunters and anglers not only to their own pastime, but to the conservation of this country's natural resources. We look to them as prime examples of good stewardship and conservation of this Nation's wildlife and wild lands. I would like to see more and more Americans showing the same type of commitment," said Turner.

Money from the sale of fishing and hunting licenses, permits, tags, and stamps is used to fund state fish and wildiife programs. License sales figures are compiled annually by the U.S. Fish and Wildife Service from information submitted by state fish and wildife agencies. State funding through the Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration and the Federal Aid in Sport Fish Restoration programs, both administered by the Service, is apportioned in part by the number of paid fishing and hunting license holders in each state.
