## NUMBER OF HUNTERS, ANGLERS REMAINS STEADY: REVENUE FROM LICENSE SALES CLIMBS SHARPLY

More than 46 million hunters and anglers purchased licenses, tags, permits, and stamps in 1992, roughly the same as in 1991. But total revenues from these sales climbed 7.6 percent to $\$ 879.7$ million.

This is good news for fish and wildife conservation since money raised through iicense sales supports state fish and wildlife agencies, their conservation projects, and their hunting, fishing, and education programs.

In announcing last year's figures, Acting U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Director Richard Smith noted that hunters and anglers have traditionally been major supporters of fish and wildlife conservation.
"Quite simply, the hundreds of millions of dollars contributed by hunters and anglers each year are the backbone of state fish and wildife conservation efforts," Smith said.

While the total number of hunters who purchased licenses climbed slightly in 1992 to $15,746,706$ from 15,718,865 in 1991, the number of licenses, tags, permits, and stamps purchased declined from 34.1 million in 1991 to 31.3 million last year. This, however, is still nearly 2 million more licenses, tags,
permits, and stamps purchased than in 1990. Revenue from these purchases totaled $\$ 481.2$ million, 9 percent higher than the $\$ 438.5$ million taken in during 1991.

The number of anglers who purchased licenses in 1992 was 30,623,765 compared with $30,742,212$ in 1991. Sales of licenses, tags, permits, and stamps climbed just over 1 percent and revenue climbed 5.9 percent to $\$ 398.5$ million.

License sales figures are compiled annually by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service from information submitted by state fish and wildife agencies. State funding through the Federal Aid in Wildife Restoration and the Federal Aid in Sport Fish Restoration programs, both administered by the Service, is apportioned in part by the number of paid fishing and hunting license holders in each state.

Under the Federal Aid program, hunters pay an 11-percent excise tax on sport arms and ammunition, a 10-percent tax on pistols and revolvers, and an 11-percent tax on certain archery equipment. Anglers pay a 10-percent excise tax on fishing equipment and a 3-percent tax on electric trolling motors and sonar fish finders. In addition, a portion of the Federal excise tax on motorboat fuels is designated for sport fish restoration under the Federal Aid program. The money is granted to the states by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to fund fish and wildlife conservation and outdoor recreation projects.
