Those filing with the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York should be aware of the following changes:

**1. Changes to Credit Card Processing on CM/ECF**: Filers may experience some minor differences when paying by credit card on CM/ECF. For more information, please see the notice posted on the Court's website,

**2. Summons in an Adversary Proceeding**: In adversary proceedings, the Clerk's Office now uses CM/ECF to create a form-generated summons to be placed on the docket. Thus, filers no longer have to submit information *via* e-mail to the Clerk's Office to have a summons issued in an adversary proceeding. [However, for the Clerk's Office to issue a summons in an *involuntary case* or *section 304 ancillary proceeding*, the filer must still submit to the Clerk's Office a prepared summons via e-mail to <u>summonsnysb@nysb.uscourts.gov</u>.] For more information on the issuance of a summons in an adversary proceeding, please see the notice posted on the Court's website, <u>http://www.nysb.uscourt.gov/pdf/summonsadvpro.pdf</u> [click on the *General Information* box toward the bottom of the first screen and, under the heading "PROCEDURE" at the top of the next screen, click on <u>Changes to Procedures for Issuing Summonses in Adversary Proceedings Effective July 26, 2004].</u>

**3. Changing an Individual Debtor's Social Security Number**. An individual debtor seeking to correct his or her social security number must follow the instructions posted on the Court's website,
