They provide emergency communications between soldiers and their families as well as a reporting service for emergency leave, personal, and other family problems. To initiate an emergency message, civilian family members need to call their local Red Cross chapter and give the soldiers name, rank,

social security number, and unit number. The message will be sent via the national messaging center, and the center will contact the soldier's Commanding Officer. Soldiers can directly contact the National Messaging Center to inquire about the status Red Cross message. Emergency Leave and Army Emergency Relief (AER) are usually unavailable without Red Cross validation. All financial assistance is provided on behalf of the AER or Aid Society applicable to the branch of service. Please contact the Red Cross if you have further questions or would like to schedule a briefing for a Family Readiness Group or a Pre-Deployment Meeting.

# ARMED FORCES DISCIPLINARY CONTROL BOARD (AFDCB)

Services Provided: The AFDCB accepts complaints against businesses and investigates cases of possible unfair practices. The board can have businesses placed off-limits to military personnel.

Bldg. 5661 Screaming Eagle Blvd. (Lee Soldier and Family Support Center) Services Provided: Financial assistance is available to active duty and retired service personnel and their family members, family members of deceased personnel, and members of the reserve components on continuous active duty for more than 30 days. Assistance will usually be provided as a non-interest bearing loan, a grant (when appropriate), or a combination loan and grant. Types of emergencies covered are: non-receipt of or loss of funds; medical, dental and hospital expenses; funeral expenses for immediate family members; travel expenses related to emergencies; rent, food, and utilities, vehicle payment, vehicle insurance, and vehicle repair.

#### Procedures for AER

Step 1: Complete DA Form 1103, "Application for AER Financial Assistance." Active duty personnel must have the commanding officer review completed application, annotate, and sign part 17 of the form.

Step 2: Documents needed: original/copy of most recent Leave and Earning Statement (LES) End of Month and Mid-Month (if applicable), spouses most recent pay voucher (if applicable) and valid ID card. Please come by the AER office to obtain a checklist for additional documents that may be required. In cases of emergency travel contact American Red Cross to activate and/or verify a Red Cross Message prior to coming to AER and bring your case number with you. If there is a natural disaster (fire, severe weather, flood, etc.), go to the American Red Cross FIRST. If ARC cannot assist, they will give you a referral statement for AER.

Step 3: If you are traveling or you live more than 50 miles from Fort Campbell or any other military installation, contact your local Red Cross chapter for assistance.

Cases AER Cannot Assist: Divorces and legal separations; ordinary leave or vacations; liquidation or consolidation of outstanding debts; business ventures or investments; maintenance of standard of living; civilian court fees, fines, judgments, liens, bail, legal fees; income taxes; goods or items of convenience, comfort, or luxury; continuing assistance; abortion; or funds to replace bad checks.

After Duty Hours: For Fort Campbell soldiers and/or family members needing funds for emergency travel that cannot wait until the next working day to report to AER, call the American Red Cross 1-877-272-7337 (Toll Free).

#### **EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM (EFMP)**

EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program that is based on public law and Department of Defense

mandates. Our office works with other military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated medical, education, housing, and community support and personnel services to families with special needs.

- World-wide relocation information (National, state and local agencies)
- Special Needs Resource Team (coordination and placement of children, youth and teens with special needs seeking Child and Youth Services programs)

COMPUTERIZED DATABASE: SITES (Standard Installation Topic Exchange Services) is an automated information system designed to provide relocation information for all the military installations within CONUS and OCONUS. Specific information contained in SITES: education, employment, medical & dental, housing, relocation services, support services and survival tips for first-termer.

**LEVY BRIEFINGS:** Orientation is conducted to provide important information to soldiers, civilian employees and family members who PCS overseas and CONUS to CONUS.

**RELOCATION RESOURCE CENTER:** A worldwide installation library of Welcome Packets is maintained for review in the Relocation Center.

A video library offers a first-hand full-color view of some of .the military installations both in the states and overseas. Foreign language tapes are available for loan.

Trip itineraries: detailed driving directions from one location to another within CONUS.

INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING: is provided to soldiers and families making a permanent change of station move. Relocation counseling will include assessment of individual and family needs and particular relocation circumstance.

INTERNATIONAL DRIVER'S LICENSE: Can be obtained through our office before departure to an overseas location. No test is required. A fee of \$10.00 is required for processing.

EAGLE FAMILY WELCOME: ACS and Turner Guest House offers Eagle Family Welcome to all spouses and service member newly arrived to Fort Campbell. Held every Tuesday 0800-1000 at the Turner Guest House. Refreshments will be provided.

MONTHLY NEWCOMERS BUS TOUR: A Newcomers Orientation Tour is provided to introduce new soldiers and family members to Fort Campbell and provide important information about Fort Campbell. The following facilities will be visited; In & Out Processing Center, Blanchfield Community Hospital, Transportation for Inbound, Claims, Legal, Family Readiness Center, Army Community Center, Education Center. WAITING FAMILIES: To provide assistance and support to spouses of service members who are on a restricted or short PCS tour.

**FOREIGN BORN SPOUSE ORIENTATION:** Orientation is provided to foreign-born spouse to provide specific information on obtaining a resident alien card, social security card, driver's license, employment, education, and English as a second language.

The AEC is conveniently located at the intersection of Screaming Eagle Boulevard and Bastogne Avenue, across the street from Turner Guest House. The mission of the AEC is to provide adult and continuing education services to soldiers, family members, Department of Army civilians and retired personnel. A variety of programs are available at the AEC to include counseling services, testing, and professional development opportunities such as college and university courses/degree programs and on-duty performance enhancement programs.

#### **Counseling Services**

The Army Education Division provides a variety of guidance and counseling services. Professional education counselors provide assistance relating to all Army Continuing Education System (ACES) programs including college/career-related decision making, guidance concerning enrollment in the BSEP program and VA education benefits counseling and referral. Counselors provide professional assistance in interpreting college admission criteria, registration procedures, obtaining required official records and unofficial transcript evaluation. Assistance is also provided with test scheduling and interpretation of results. To talk with an Army Education Counselor, call 798-5886/6978. Counseling Branch hours of operation are:

#### **Testing Services**

The Testing Center provides monitored testing for military-related tests for skill assessment and placement as well as for college credit, evaluation and placement including most of the nationally administered standardized tests. Education Counselors also use many of these tests for advisory counseling on academic and military goals. For information on the testing programs offered contact an Education Counselor at 798-5886 or the Testing Office at 798-3402.

#### Learning Resource Center (LRC)

The LRC is a state-of-the-art computer lab with 60 workstations available for Internet usage that is available to soldiers, DoD civilians, adult family members and students enrolled in courses at the Army Education Center. A variety of computer-related training is available in personal computer software and hardware. Self-paced computer-based instruction is available in typing tutorials, foreign languages, Word, Excel, PowerPoint, FrontPage, General Education Development (GED) preparation and the College Level Examination Program (CLEP). Soldiers desiring to enroll in the Army Correspondence Course Program (ACCP) or request additional sub courses can accomplish this in the LRC. Instructors will assist students in the selection of programs and courses. No fees are assessed for using the LRC, which is open seven days a week (except for holidays). #### Basic Skills Education Program (BSEP)

BSEP is a two-week on-duty program designed to help soldiers master the functional reading, writing, and math skills required of their Army jobs. The goals of the program are to: improve job proficiency, hone math skills in preparation for BNCOC and raise GT scores for career advancement and reenlistment purposes. Completing the program also increases the soldier's potential for completing college, technical, vocational and other high quality educational programs. For course dates and enrollment information soldiers should contact an education counselor or call the BSEP office at 798-2401.

#### College Program

Schools at the AEC offer courses and degrees at various levels of post-secondary education – associates through masters. Undergraduate college terms are conducted four times a year with a new term starting the beginning of each fiscal quarter. Registration takes place a week prior to each term. Terms last eight weeks and normally meet twice a week, two and a half hours per meeting. Graduate terms vary in length and meeting times. For specific term dates, registration procedures and course scheduled, contact an Army Education Counselor or the particular college's office – all conveniently located in the AEC.

The eArmyU program is an on-line computer-based program for enlisted soldiers that offers "anywhere, anytime" access to high quality learning opportunities from accredited postsecondary and technical institutions while on active duty. Approximately twen-



ty-two institutions offer a variety of certificates as well as degree programs ranging from associates masters level. Soldiers must have a minimum of three years remaining on active duty and may reenlist to meet this requirement. Other eligibility requirements apply; more information is available at www.earmyu.com.

#### Tuition Assistance (TA)

The TA program assists eligible soldiers enrolling in off-duty college classes by paying all or part of the cost of tuition. Effective 1 OCT 02, the Army will pay 100% of an educational institution's allowable tuition and fees up to the newly established semester hour cap of \$250 (\$166.67 per quarter hour. There is an annual ceiling of \$4500.) TA may also be authorized for certain licenses and certifications. For more information contact an Army Education Counselor.

#### Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Programs

Three general categories of VA Education Benefits are available with eligibility depending upon the individual's enlistment and separation status. Registration: All dogs and cats residing on Fort Campbell must be micro chipped and registered with the VTF. Owners must present copy of rabies and other vaccinations if their services are elsewhere. Wild animals such as skunks, raccoons, monkeys, wolves, wolf crosses, etc. are not authorized to be kept as pets on Fort Campbell and are therefore not treated at this facility.

The day prior to your surgery or procedure, call between 1400 (2 pm) - 1700 (5 pm) your time of arrival (798-8143). If your surgery is on a Monday you will need to call the Friday before. Please read the instruction sheet you receive in the Pre-Admission Unit and follow all directions.

- The night before your procedure do not eat or drink ANYTHING after midnight. Children will receive special instructions from the pre-admissions staff. Additionally, do not smoke or drink any alcoholic beverages. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE DIRECTIONS MAY RESULT IN THE CANCELLATION OF YOUR PROCEDURE. YOU ALSO RUN THE RISK OF GETTING VERY ILL.
- Children are not allowed, unless the child is a patient.
- Due to limited space in our rooms, only ONE visitor is allowed at any time unless the patient is a child, then both parents may be present based upon space.
- Appointment times are ready at 1400 hrs (2 pm) the day prior to your scheduled surgery. We encourage you to begin calling at 1400 hrs (2pm).
- Your time of arrival is not your time of surgery. Our goal is to get your procedure done in a timely manner. Delays do occur over which we have no control. We will do our best to keep you informed.
- Please arrive on time and wear comfortable clothing.
- It is important that you have an escort to drive you home when you are discharged from Same Day Surgery. You will not be allowed to drive yourself home

POST ANESTHESIA CARE UNIT (RECOVERY ROOM):

The Post-Anesthesia Care Unit (PACU) is where you wake up after your surgery. We take great pride in caring for you. When your surgery is finished the PACU is where your physician and the anesthesia provider bring you for your first phase of recovery.

Things to expect in the Recovery Room:

 It is anticipated that you may have some pain, nausea/vomiting during your recovery from anesthesia. Be aware that you have a dedicated, skillful and caring staff to help you through these discomforts.

- 2. We will place EKG leads on you and attach the leads to a monitor so we can monitor your heart rate while you are in the recovery room. We may need to attach you to other machines in order to maintain your health and keep you comfortable.
- 3. We will ask you to take deep breaths and cough. This is to assist you to a quicker recovery
- 4. Since the recovery room is usually a bit cool, we will cover you with warm blankets to keep you comfortable.
- 5. The recovery room is not a place where visitors are routinely allowed. However, as situations dictate, we will allow one visitor at a time for a very short period.
- 6. We are committed to your care and will make every effort to keep you and your loved ones informed about care.

#### School/Sports Physicals

School and sports physicals are provided all year long by the child's primary care manager in the appropriate clinic (Red, White, Blue or Young Eagle) where the child is assigned. Family members not enrolled in TRICARE Prime to Blanchfield Army Community Hospital will receive such services from the child's designated network provider. The Family Advocacy Program (FAP) provides assessment and counseling services for victims, offenders and families of child abuse/neglect and spouse abuse. Services are also offered to families "at risk" for incidents of domestic violence. Services include individual, family and group therapy to address anger control, communication skills, relationship enhancement and parenting skills. There is a FAP social worker on call after normal duty hours and on weekends to address child abuse/neglect and spouse abuse emergency cases. Call the hospital's operator at 798-8400 and ask for the social worker on call.

Procedures to schedule appointments: Walk-in or call. All allegations of abuse will be screened immediately and scheduled for an assessment at that time. Crisis intervention services are available during and after duty hours and on weekends and holidays.

Special Information: Priority is given to reported cases of child abuse/neglect and spouse abuse. Requests for individual, marital and family therapy not related to family advocacy may be seen on a limited basis or referred to other agencies on and off Inpatient discharge planning is conducted through Outcomes Management.

School-age children of Fort Campbell soldiers are educated in predominantly 3 school districts. Specifically, students who live on the installation attend Fort Campbell DDESS School District which is located on-post. Other military-sponsored students are educated in one of the off-post school districts depending on location of residence. Gemerally, the school districts are Clarksville/Montgomery County School District located in Clarksville, Tennessee, and Christian County School District located in Hopkinsville, Kentucky. A small percentage of military students are supported by two rural school districts, namely Trigg County Kentucky and Stewart County

# IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION FOR SPOUSES

It is very important for you, as a military spouse, to have in your possession certain documents. If you are required to take full responsibility for the family for any reason, you will be able to do so with no problems. Your sponsor should have most of this information. SIT DOWN WITH HIM OR HER AND GATHER THIS INFORMATION AND THESE DOCUMENTS. THE HOUR YOU SPEND GOING OVER THIS WILL SAVE YOU TIME LATER ON. KEEP THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS IN A SPECIAL CONTAINER THAT YOU CAN DEFINITELY FIND IMMEDIATELY!!!!

- 1. Marriage Certificate.
- Birth Certificate of all family members.
- Shot Records (up-to-date), of all family members, including pets.
- 4. Citizenship papers, if any.
- Adoption papers, if any.
- 6. Passports, if any.
- Armed Forces Identification Cards of ALL family members (10 years of age or older).
- 8. Your sponsor's Social Security number.
- All Government and Civilian Life Insurance policies - or a list of companies, policy numbers, types of insurance, local and out-of-town addresses - INCLUDE EACH COMPANY'S TELE-PHONE NUMBER WHEN POSSIBLE.
- 10. Last LES (Leave and Earnings Statement).
- 11. POWER OF ATTORNEY. Keep several copies. You may need a copy for the Transportation Office, licensing agency, or landlord. There are some things you cannot accomplish in the absence of the military sponsor, i.e. selling a car or registering it; signing a deed for your spouse; and arranging for quarters or transportation through the military. A signed power of attorney is a powerful document. It can be easily abused. Get one if needed, but be very careful in deciding to whom you give it.
- 12. BOTH HUSBAND'S AND WIFE'S WILL. In some states, if the husband does not have a current will, in case of his death, the children or parents receive two-thirds of the estate, and the wife, one-third.
- 13. IT IS FOR YOUR PROTECTION THAT BOTH PARTIES HAVE WILLS. The Legal Assistance Office can prepare these important documents for you. You should review your will every three years, or more often to make sure it accomplishes your goals upon your death.
- 14. NINE (9) COPIES OF YOUR SPOUSE'S TDY and/or PCS ORDERS. If you must move by yourself, you will need extra copies of these orders. However, with these copies you can have others made without cost to you by going to your sponsor's unit.
- 15. CURRENT ADDRESSES AND TELEPHONE NUMBERS of all members of IMMEDIATE FAMILIES of both you and your spouse. Immediate family includes Father, Mother, (if adopted, Stepfather and/or Stepmother), a person in Loco Parentis, Children, Brother(s), Sister(s). You may also wish to include other living blood relatives such as

Grandparents. You should have all important telephone numbers you may need in case of emergency.

Services Provided: TRICARE is the medical program for active duty members, qualified family members, non-Medicare eligible retirees and their family members and survivors of all uniformed services. It is designed to expand access to care, assure high quality care, control health care costs for patients and taxpayers alike, and improve medical readiness. TRICARE is a "managedcare" health care program managed by the military in partnership with civilian contractors. For each of 12 regions of the country, a military Lead Agent will be responsible for overseeing the program. Lead Agents are senior military health care professionals. TRICARE Standard is a fee-forservice option. TRICARE Extra, a preferred provider option that saves money over Standard. TRICARE Prime, an option similar to civilian Health maintenance organizations (HMO). The main challenge for most is deciding which TRI-CARE option -- Prime, Extra, or Standard -- is best for them. Enrollment is only required for TRI-CARE Prime; there is no enrollment to use TRI-CARE Extra or TRICARE Standard. THERE ARE NO ENROLLMENT FEES FOR ACTIVE DUTY FAMILIES.

Retiree families have an enrollment fee (\$230.00 for an individual; \$460.00 for a family). If you have other primary health care insurance, TRICARE Prime may not be your best option. Beneficiary Service Representatives are available at your local TRICARE Service Center to help you decide which option is better for you.
