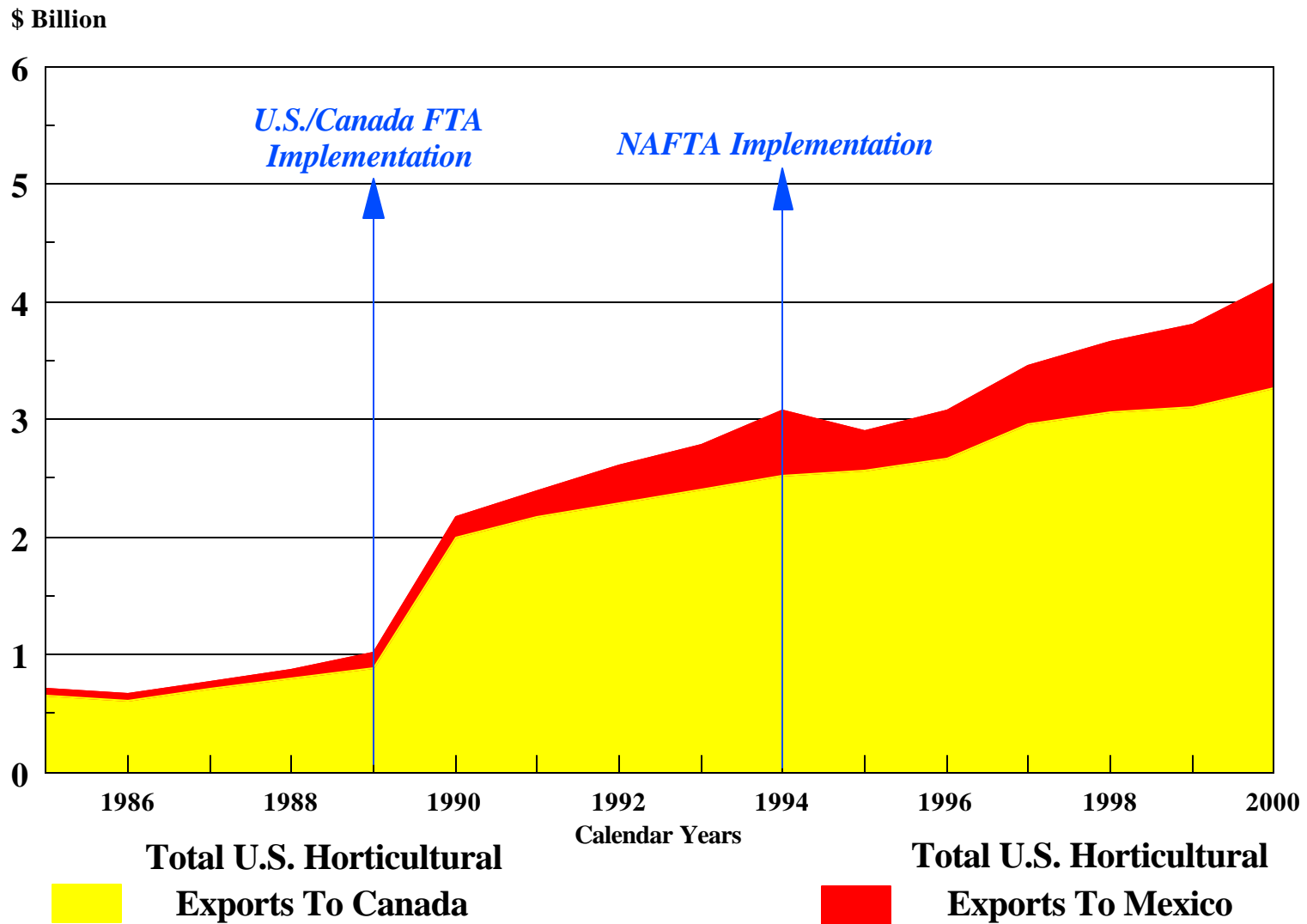

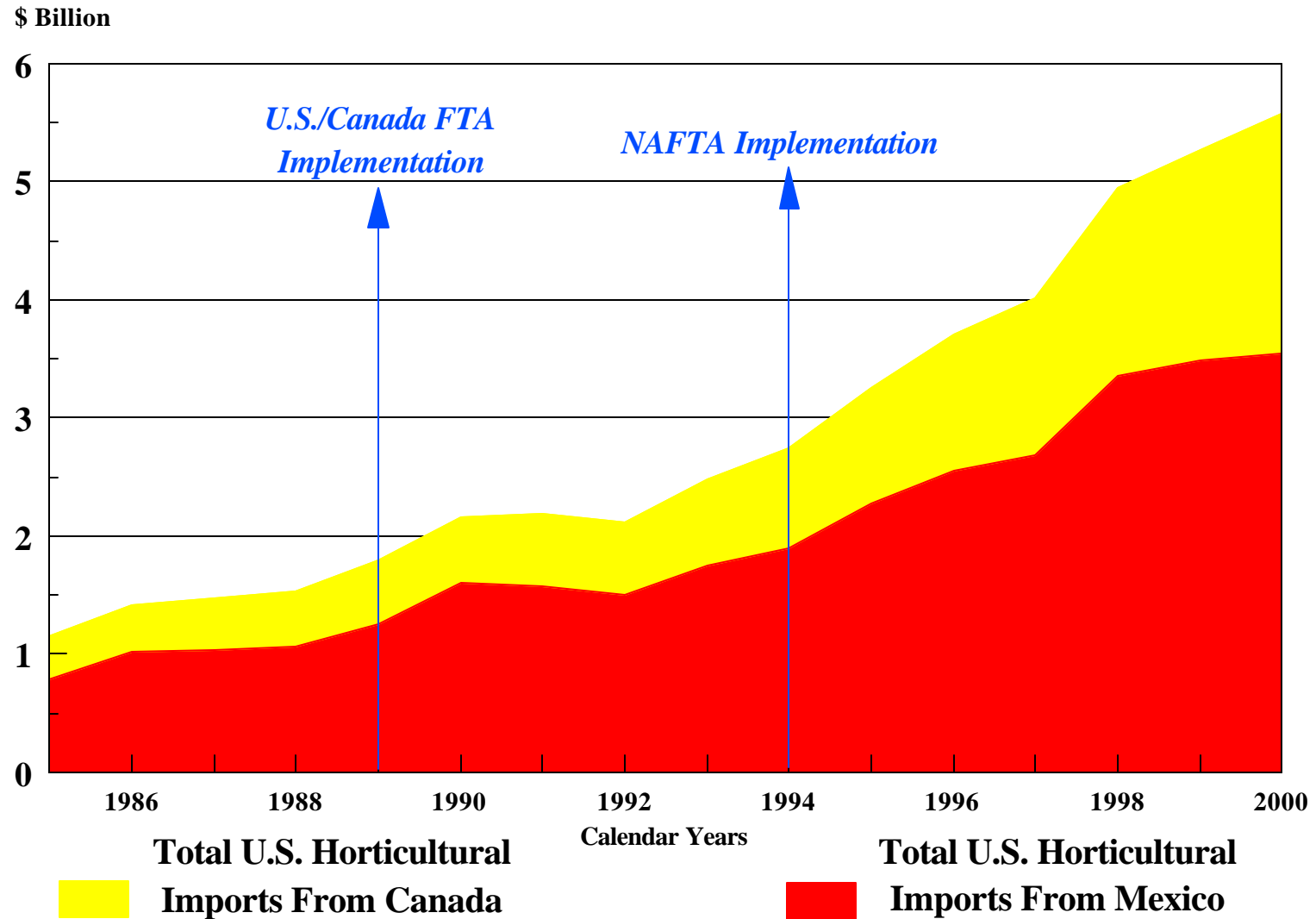

U.S. Horticultural Product Exports To Canada And Mexico Have Benefited From Free Trade



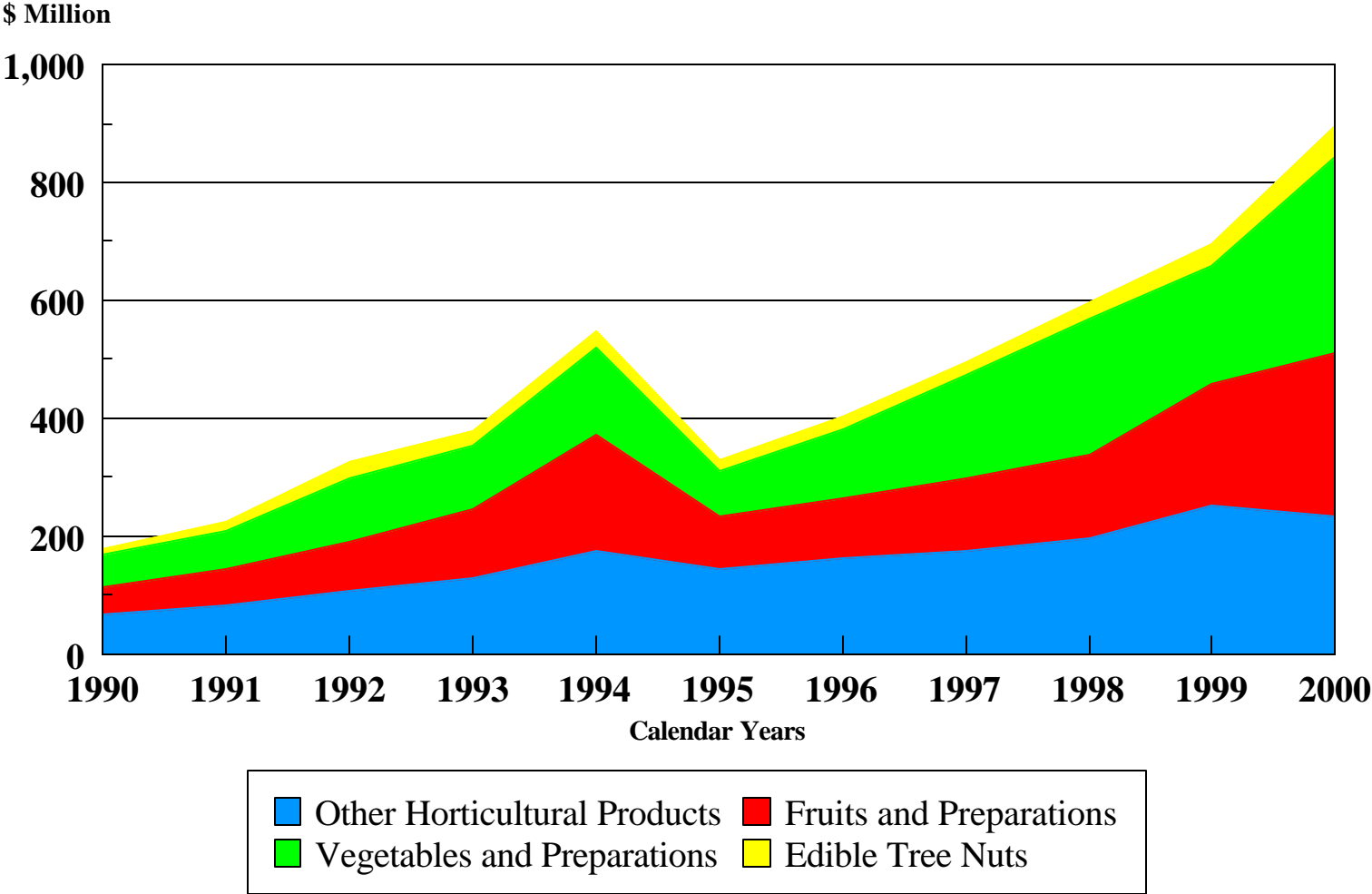

Free Trade Has Also Boosted U.S. Horticultural Imports From Mexico And Canada



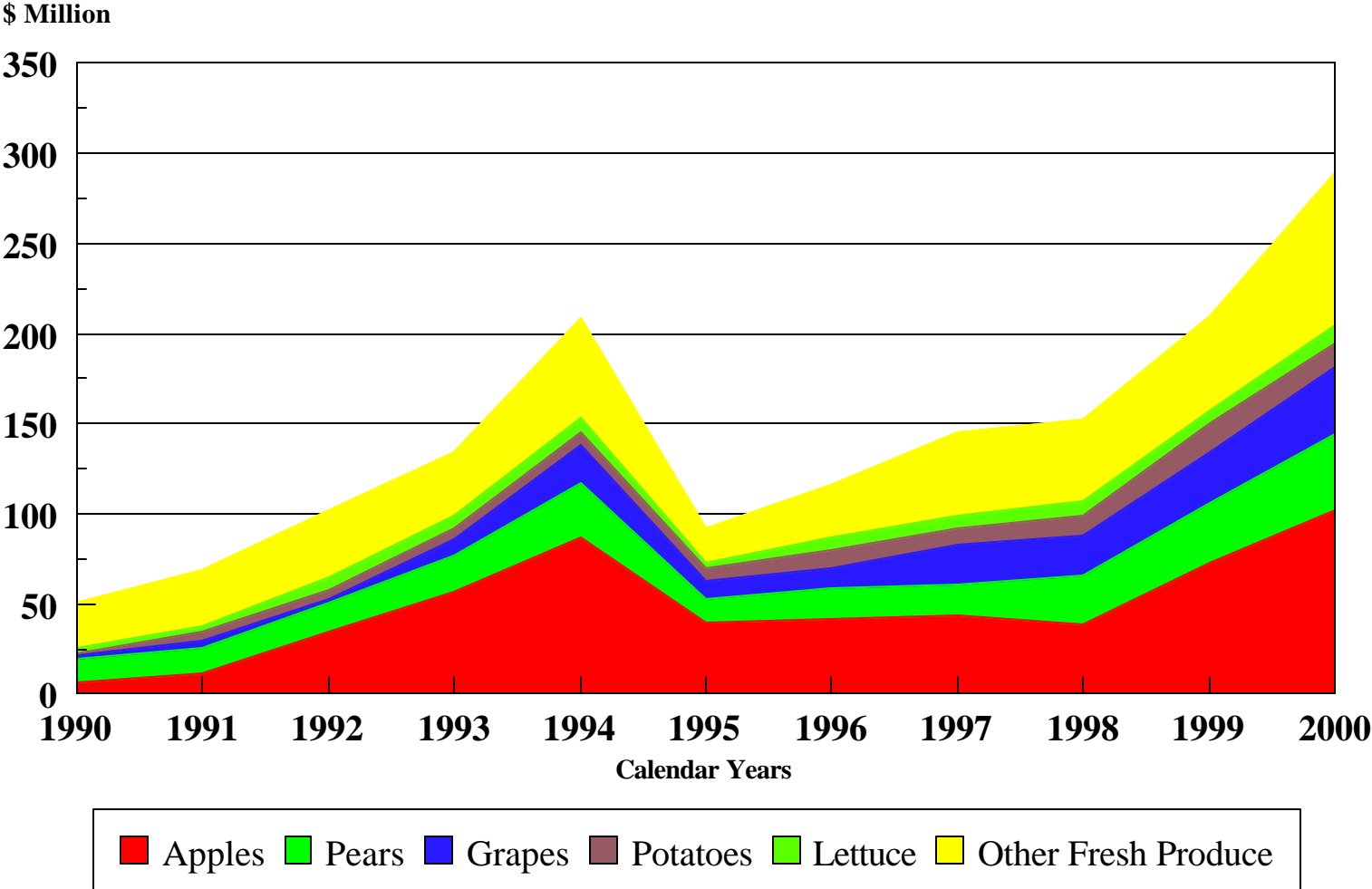

Total U.S. Horticultural Product Exports To Mexico Reached A Record \$897 Million In Calendar Year 2000



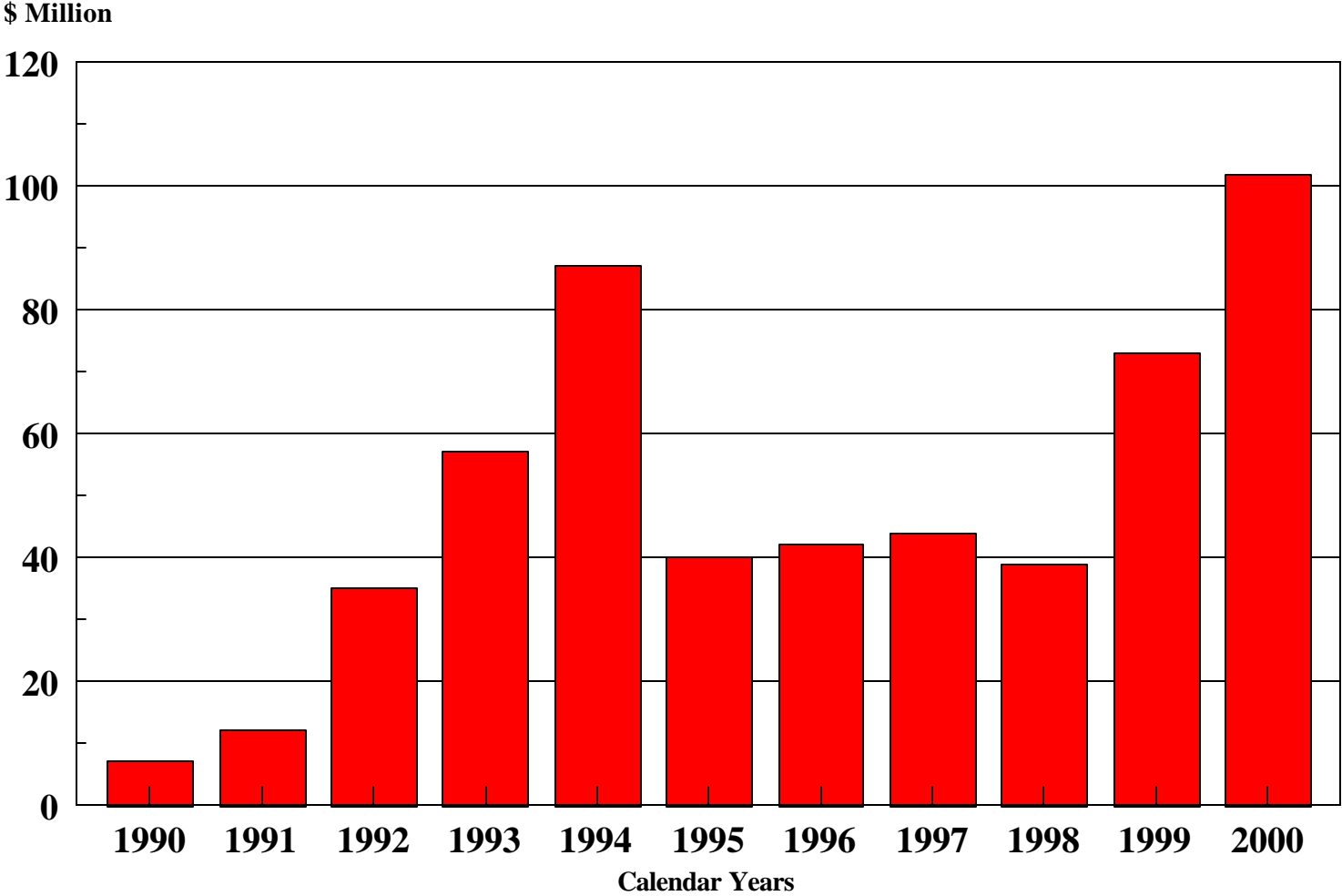

U.S. Fresh Horticultural Sales To Mexico Also Reached A Record In CY 2000



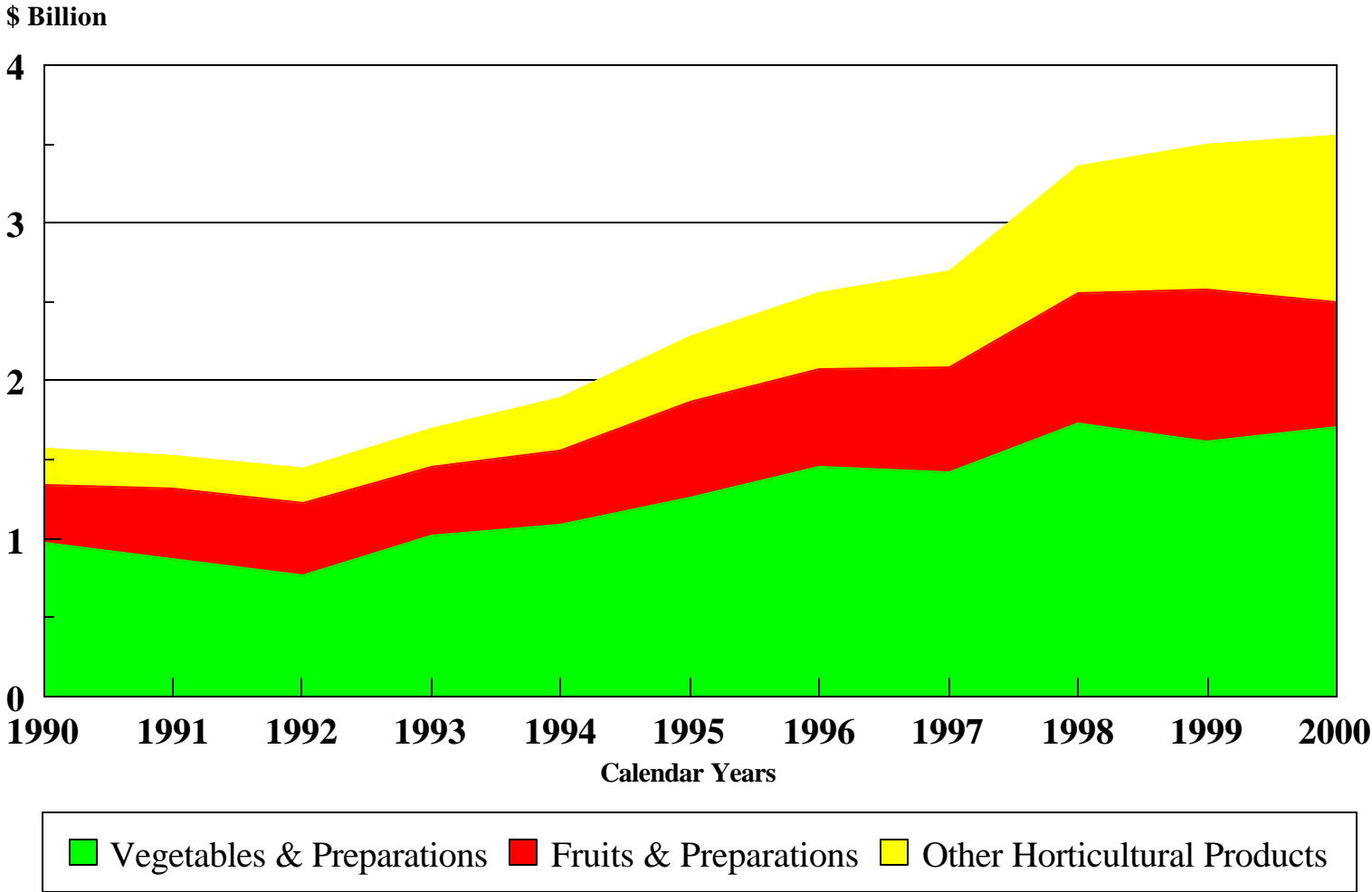

U.S. Apples Sales, The Major U.S. Fresh Horticultural Product Exported To Mexico, Reached A Record \$102 Million In CY 2000



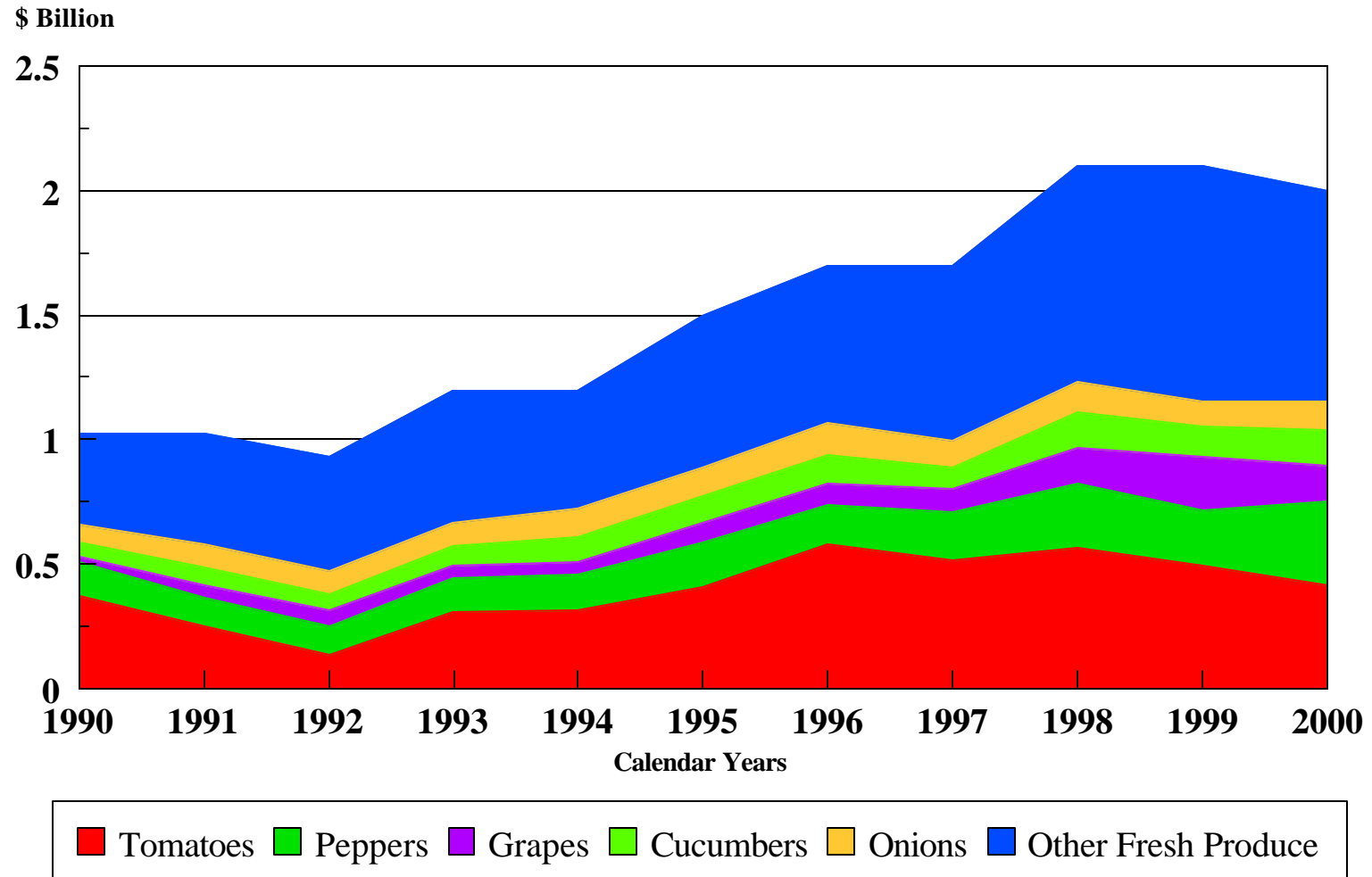

U.S. Horticultural Product Imports From Mexico Reached Another Record In CY 2000



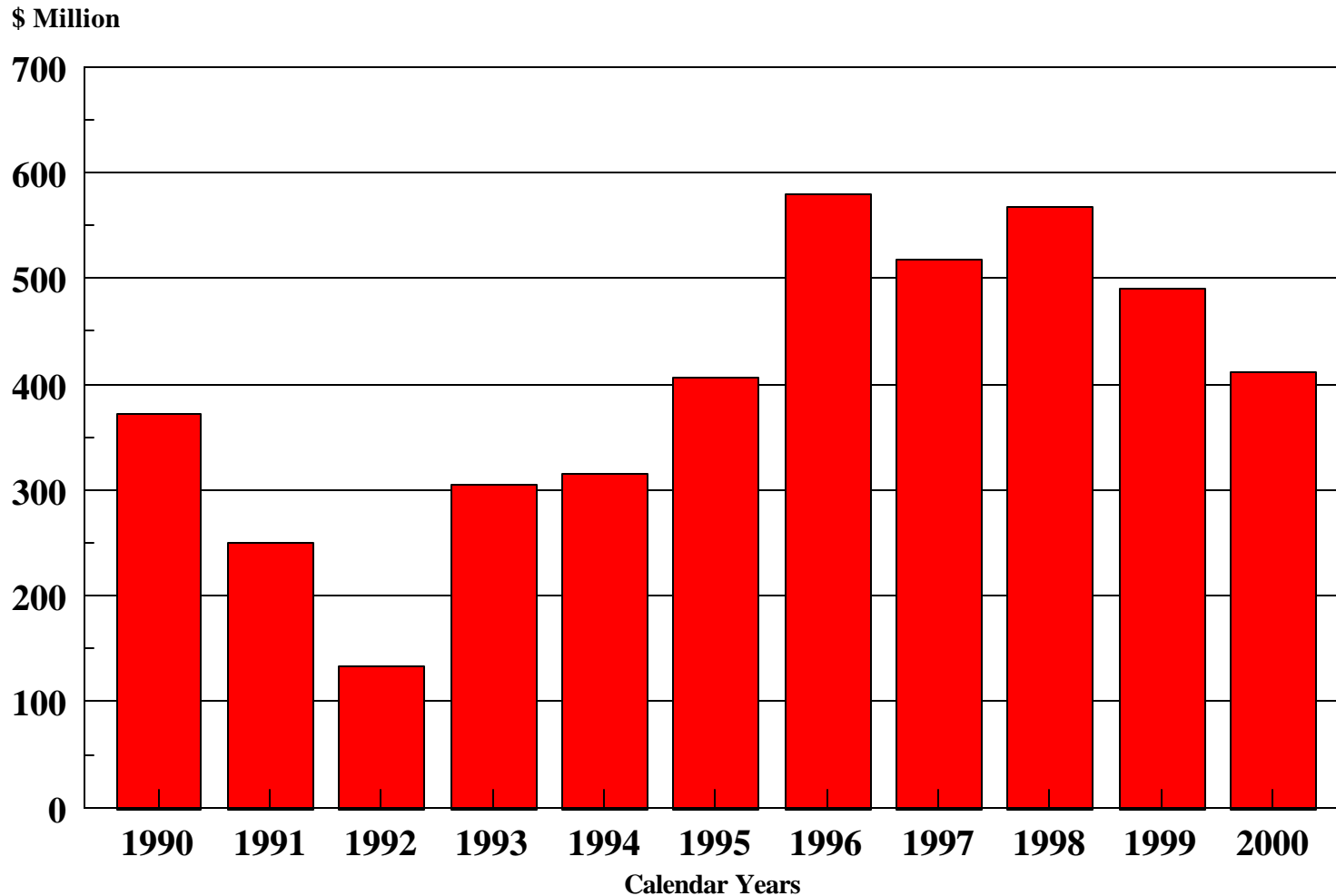

U.S. Imports Of Fresh Fruits & Vegetables From Mexico Decreased In CY 2000



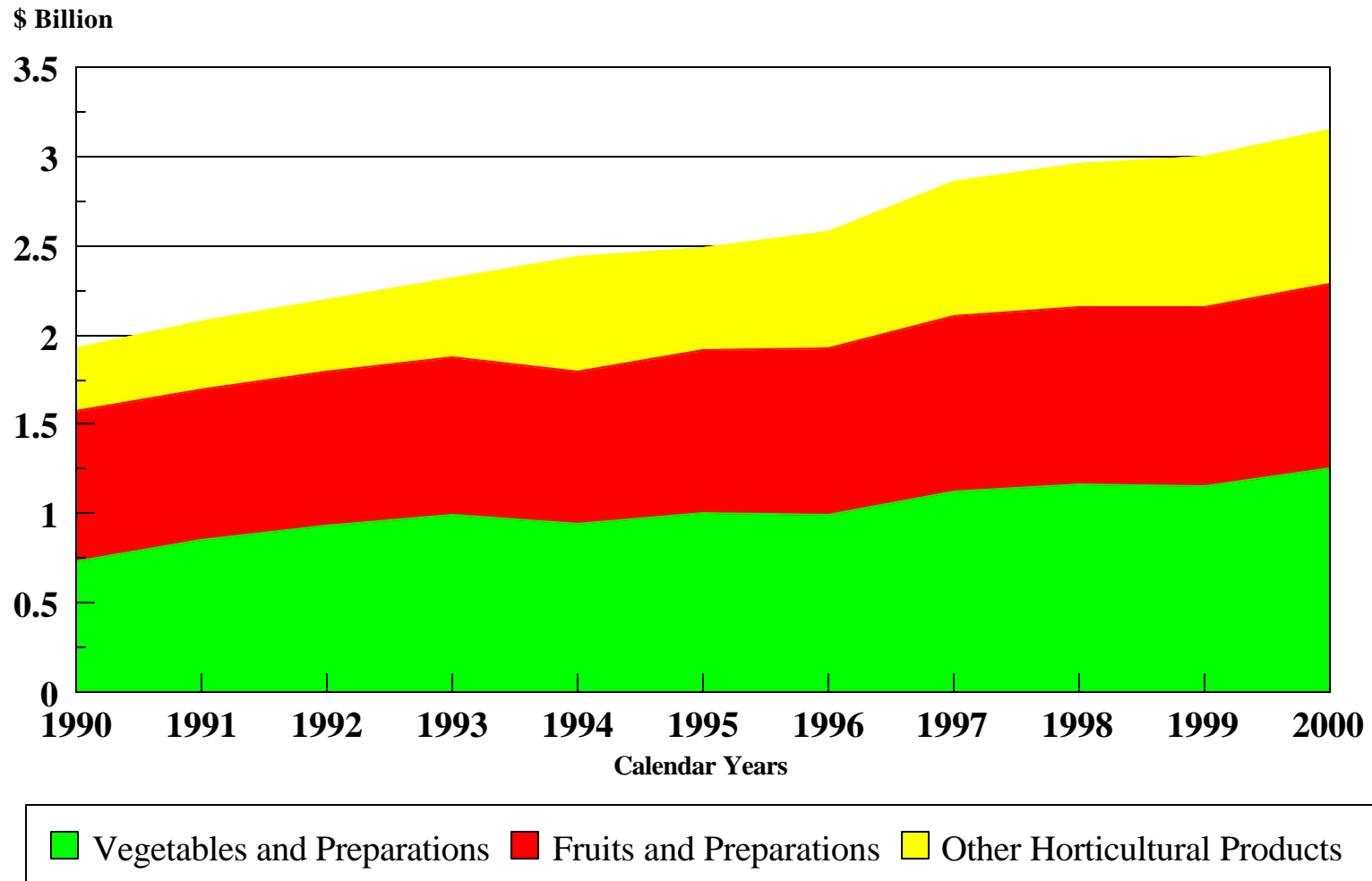

Tomatoes Are The Leading Fresh Horticultural Product The United States Imports From Mexico; But Value Has Decreased For Two Straight Years



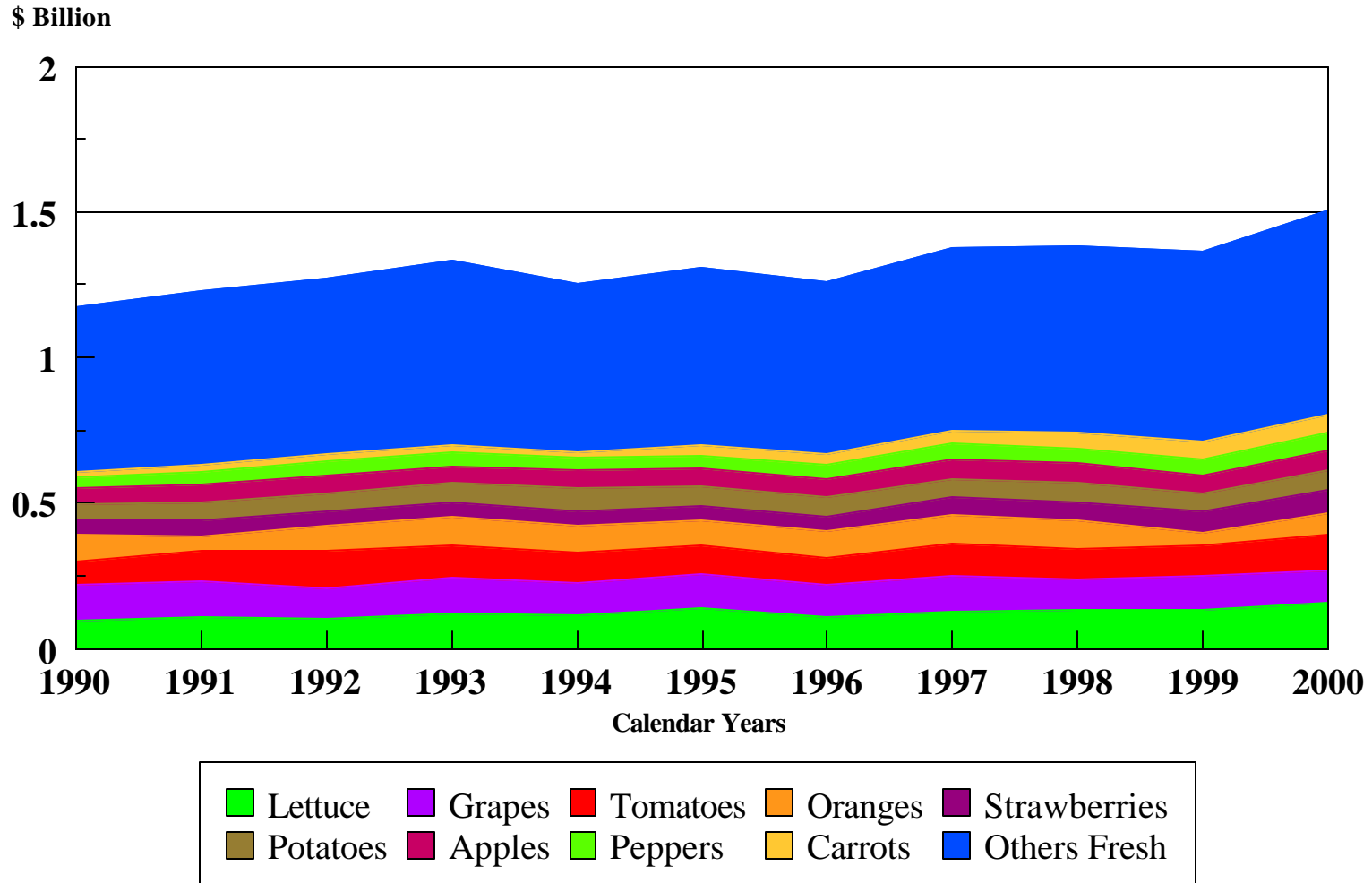

U.S. Horticultural Product Exports To Canada Reached a Record \$3.3 Billion in CY 2000



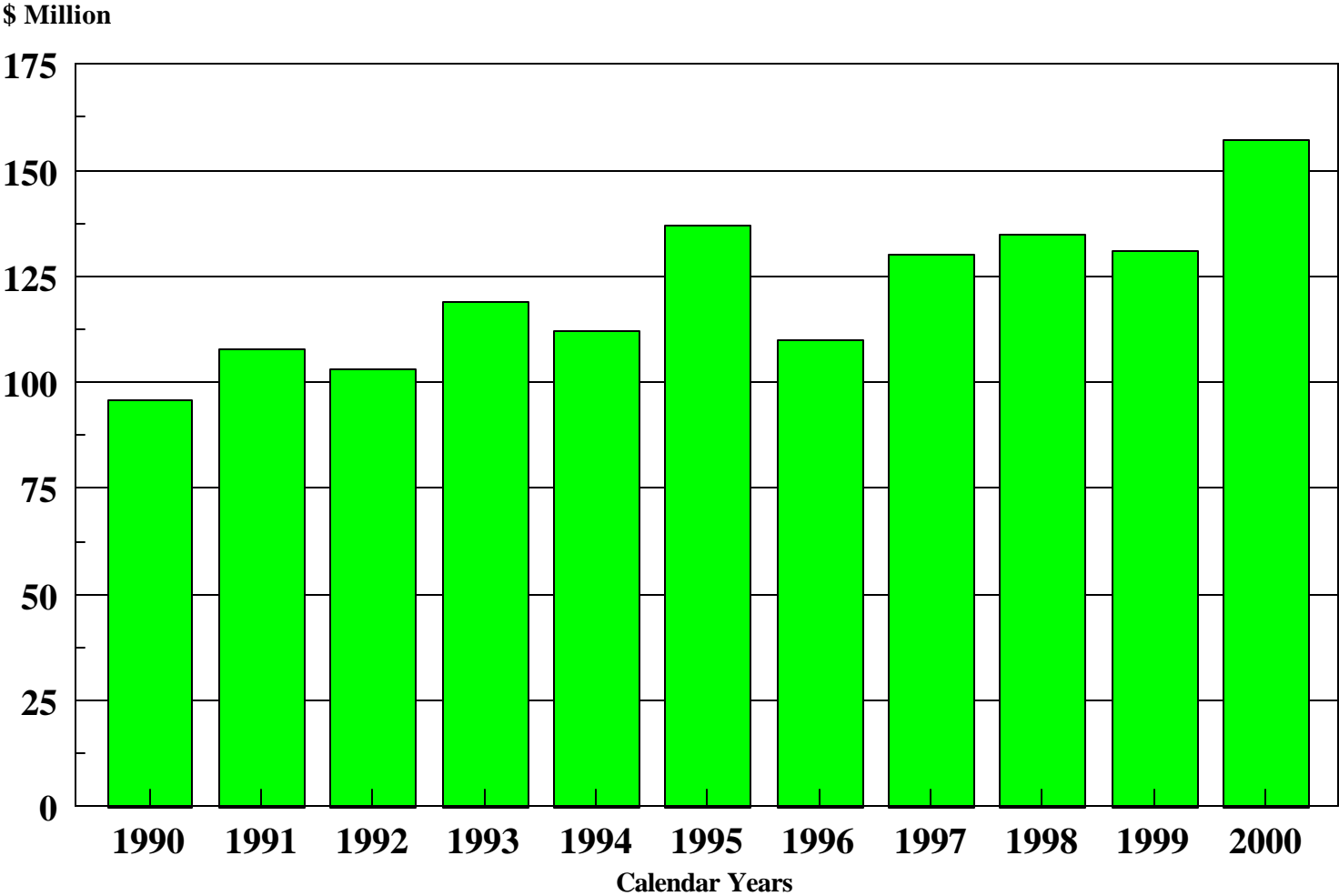

Fresh Fruits & Vegetables Account For Nearly Half The Value of Total U.S. Horticultural Exports to Canada



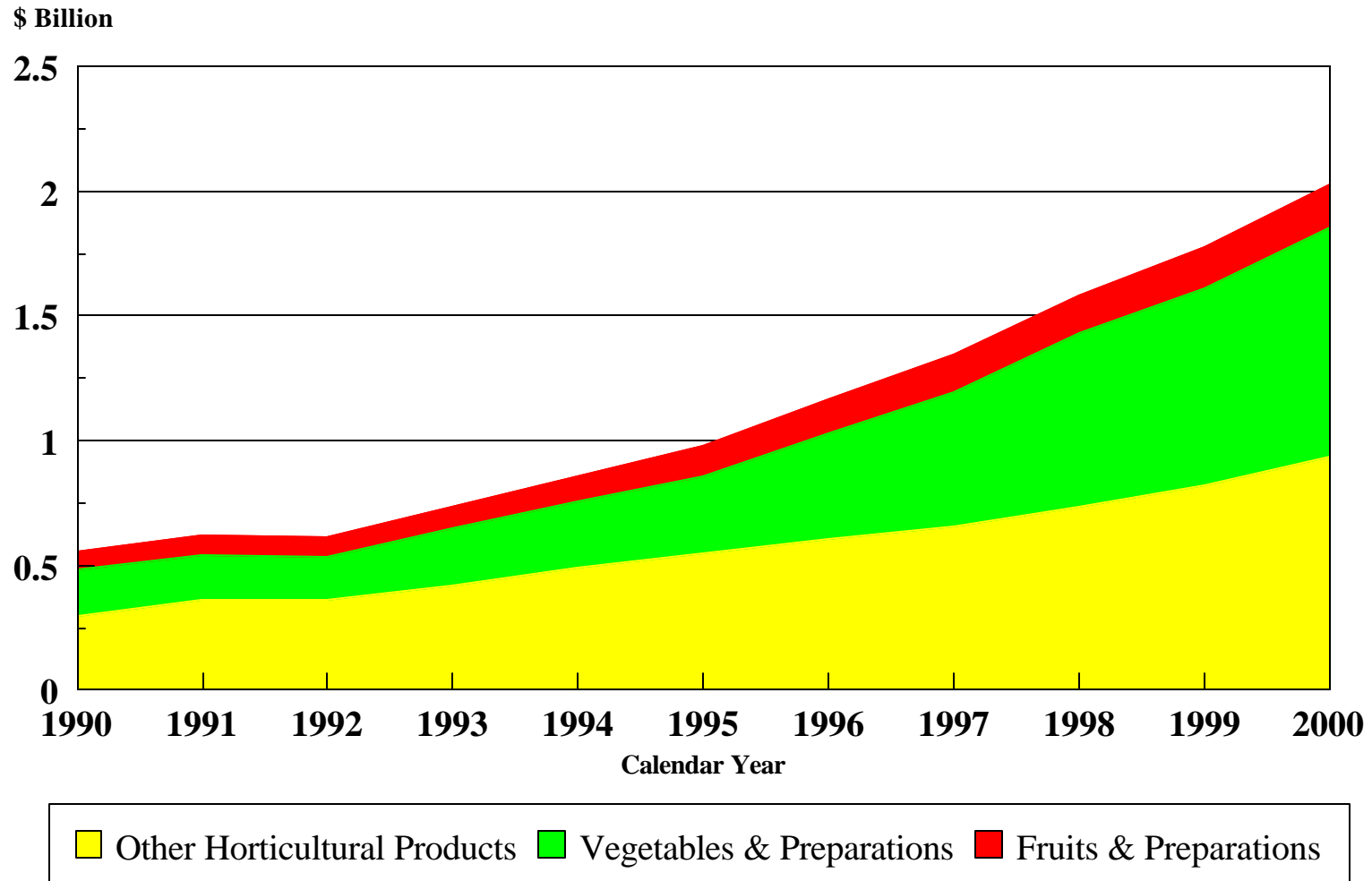

U.S. Lettuce Sales, The Leading U.S. Fresh Horticultural Product Exported To Canada, Reached A Record \$157 Million In CY 2000



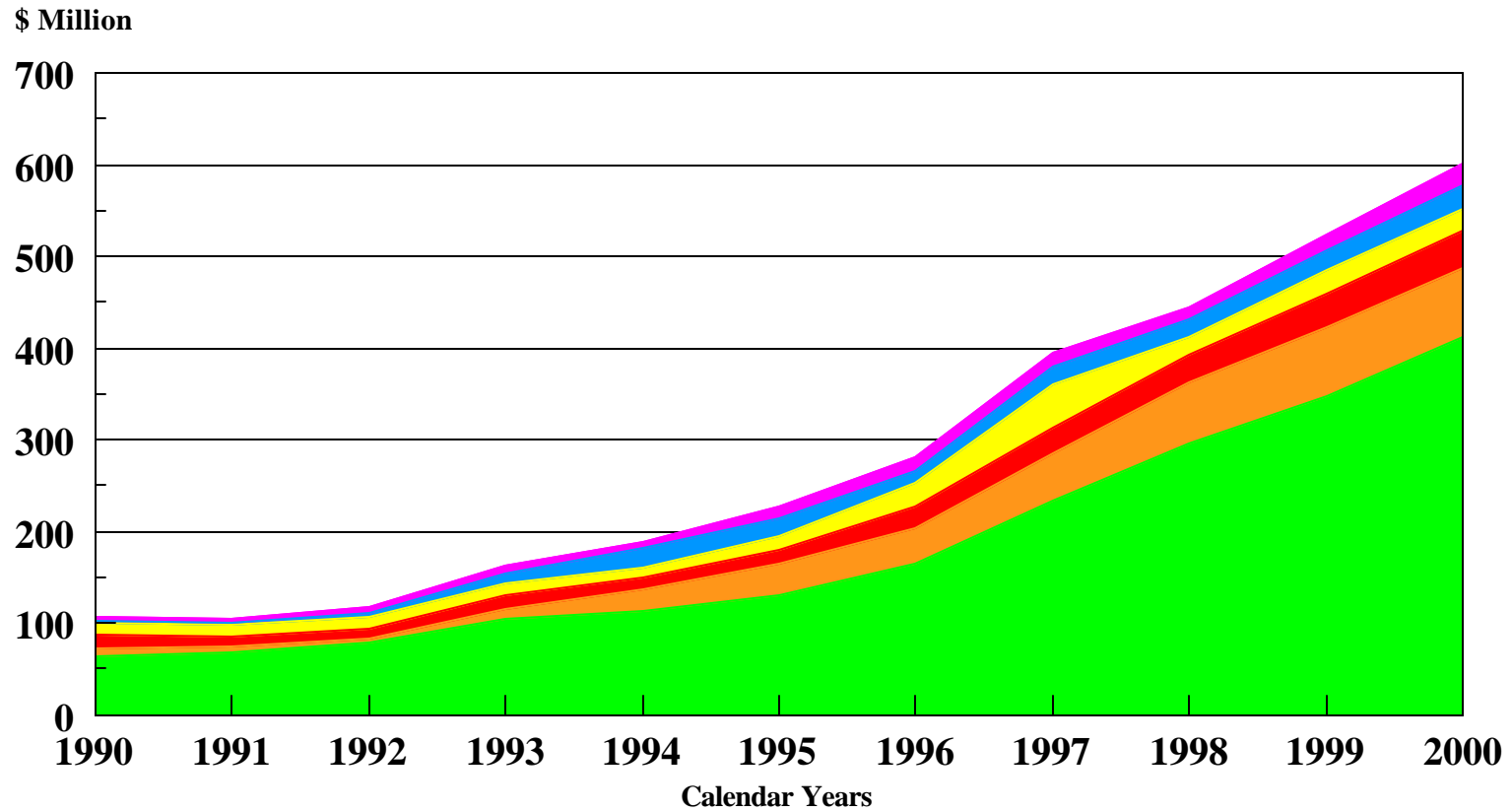

U.S. Imports Of Canadian Horticultural Products Have More Than Tripled Since 1990



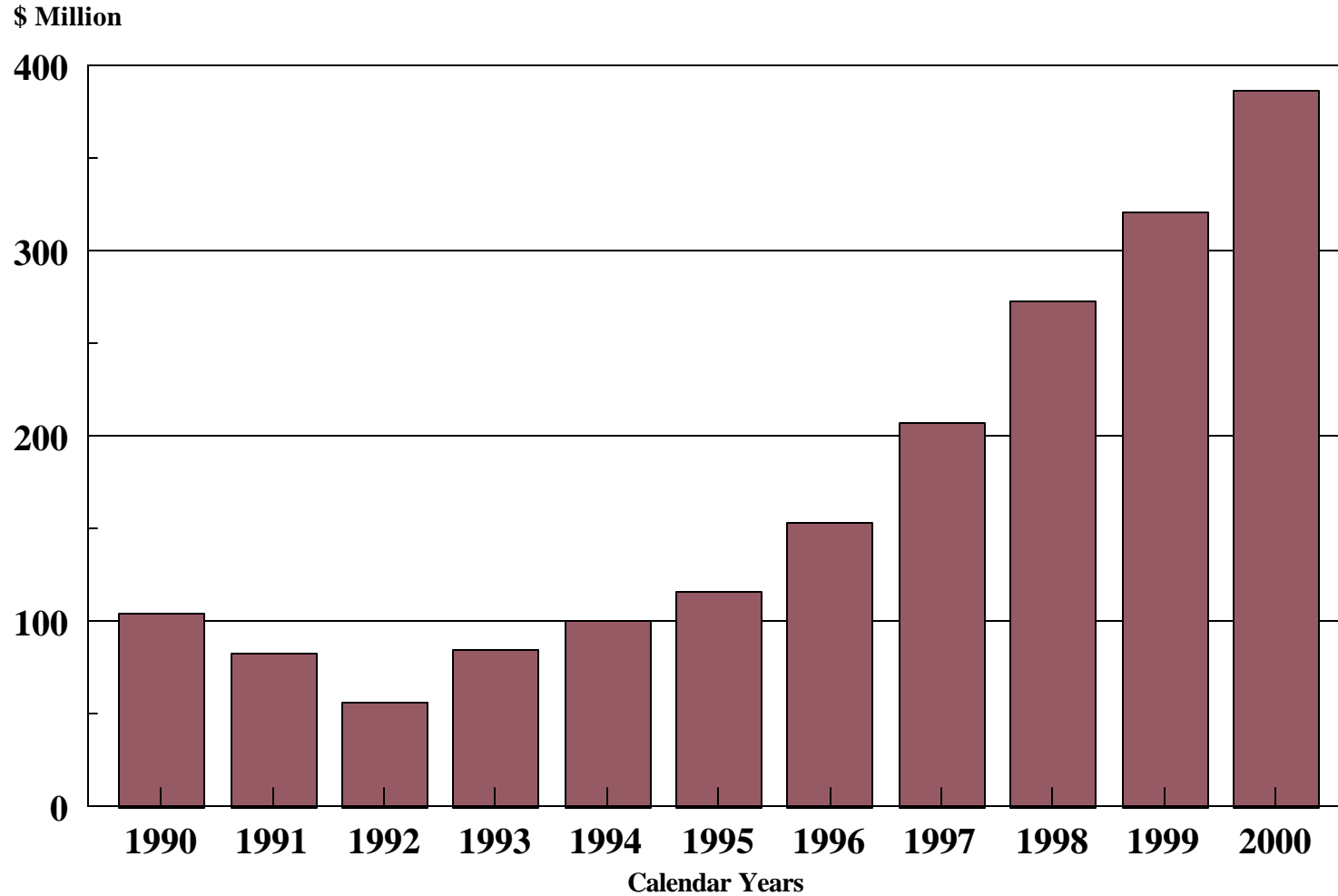

Processed Fruits and Vegetables Account For About 30 Percent Of The Value Of Total U.S. Horticultural Product Imports From Canada



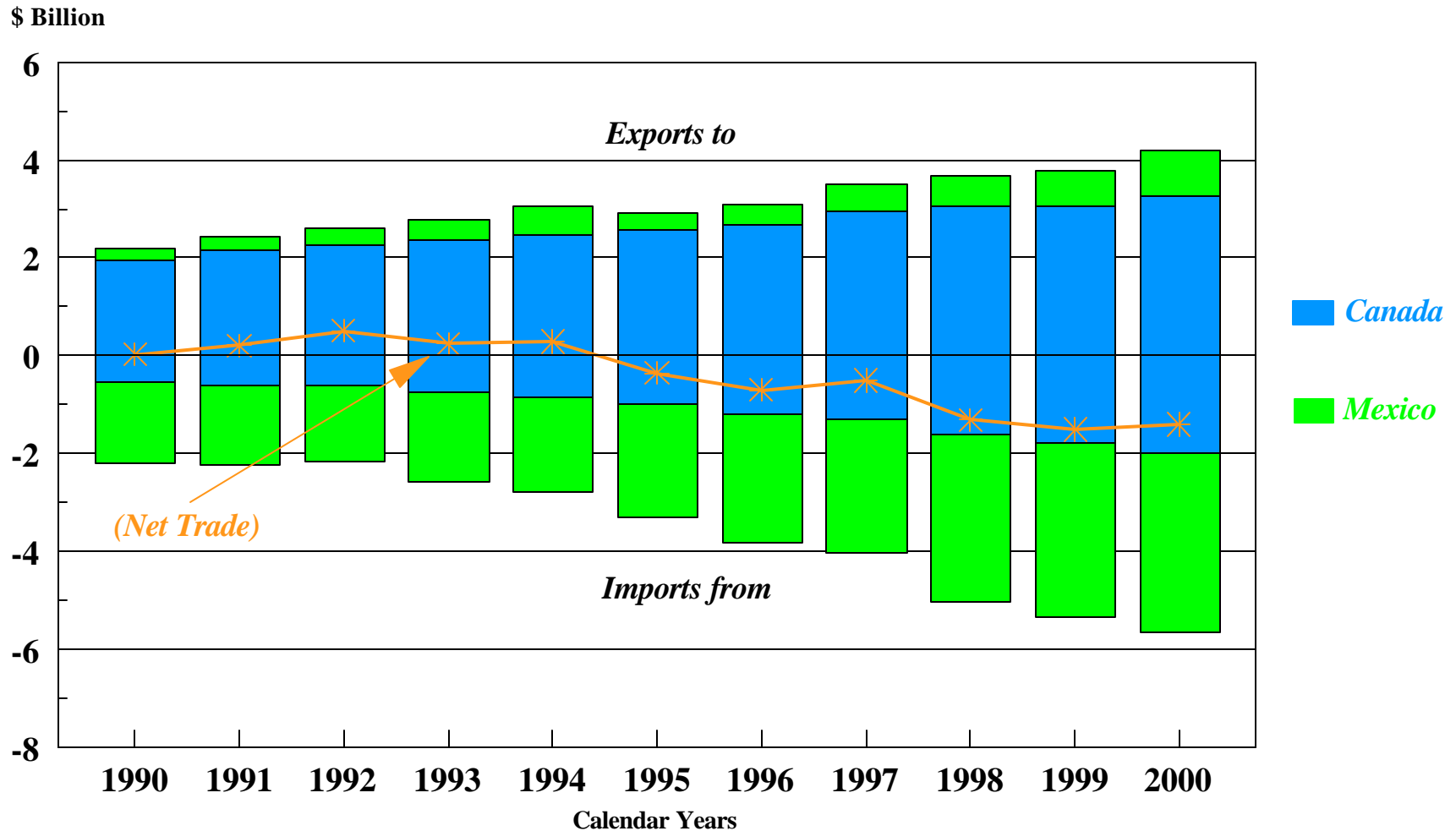

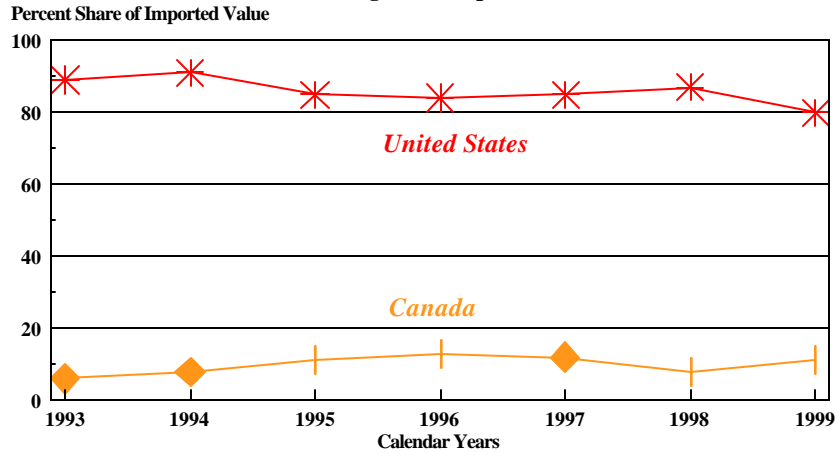

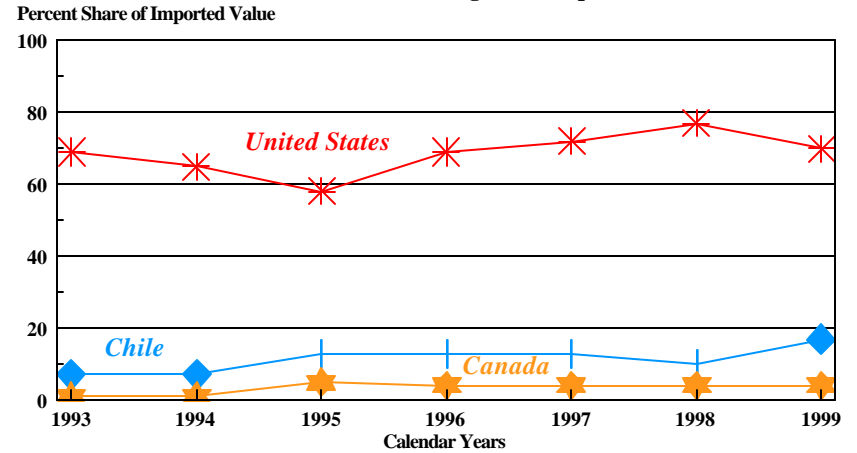

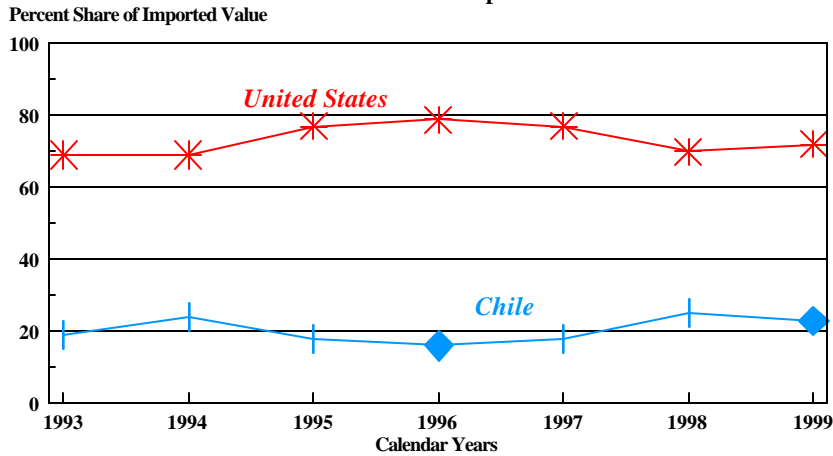

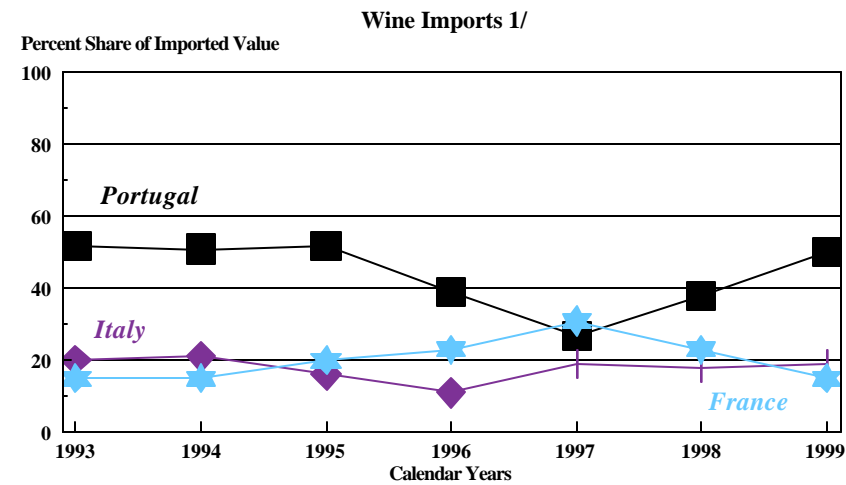
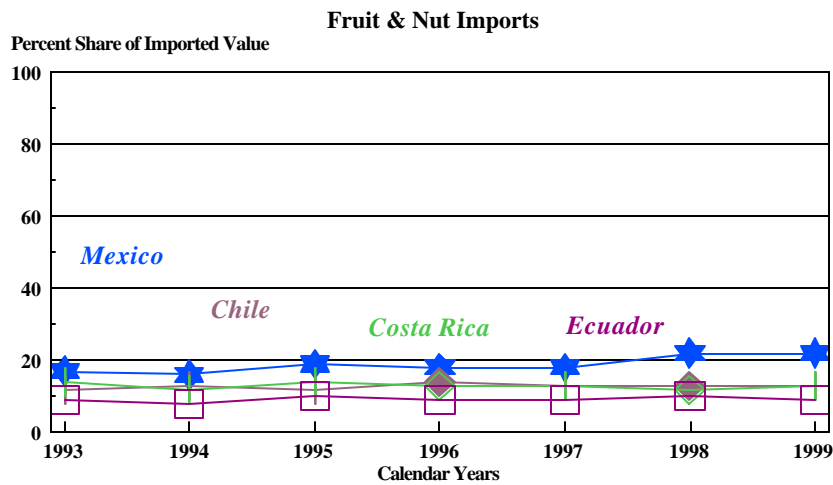
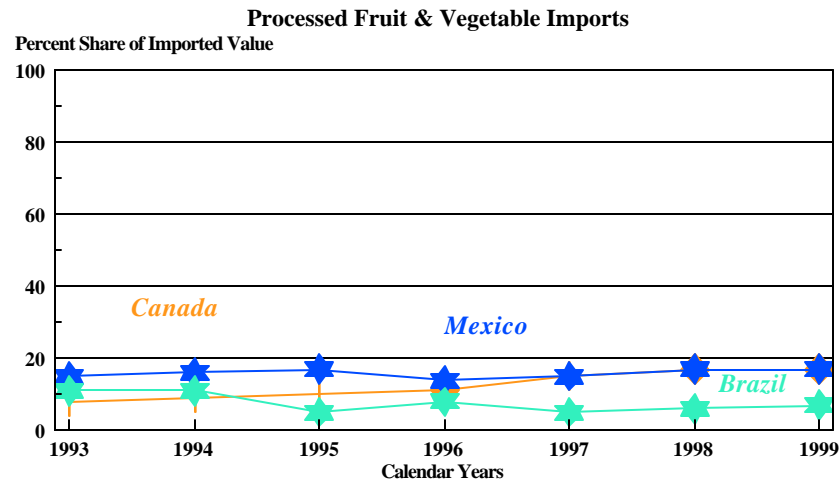
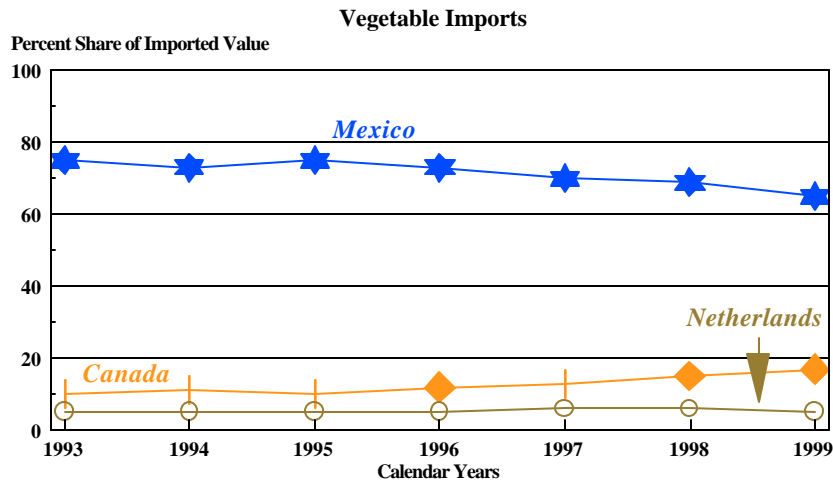
Canada Imports Most Horticultural Products From The United States

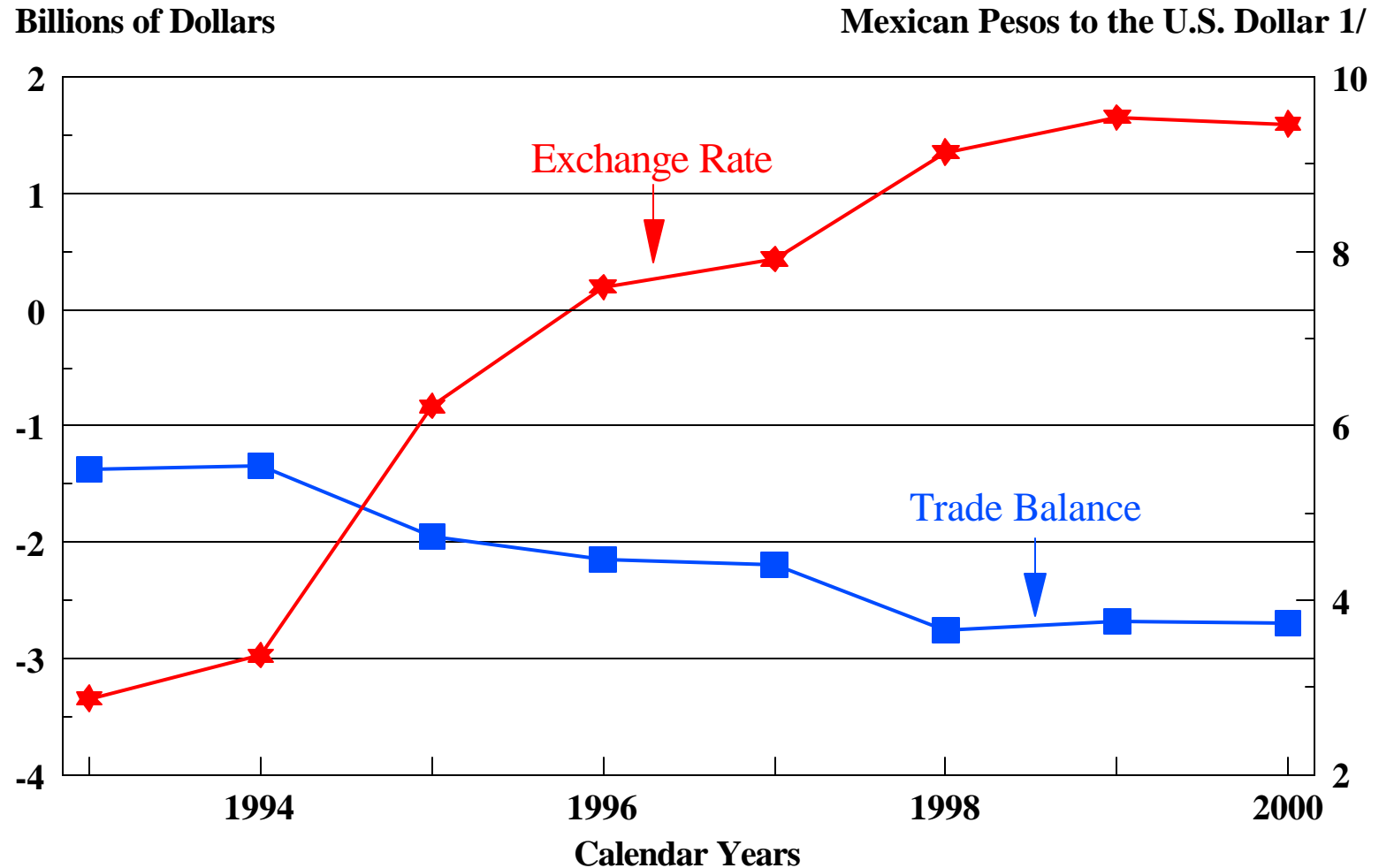
The Origin Of U.S. Horticultural Product Imports Is More Diverse

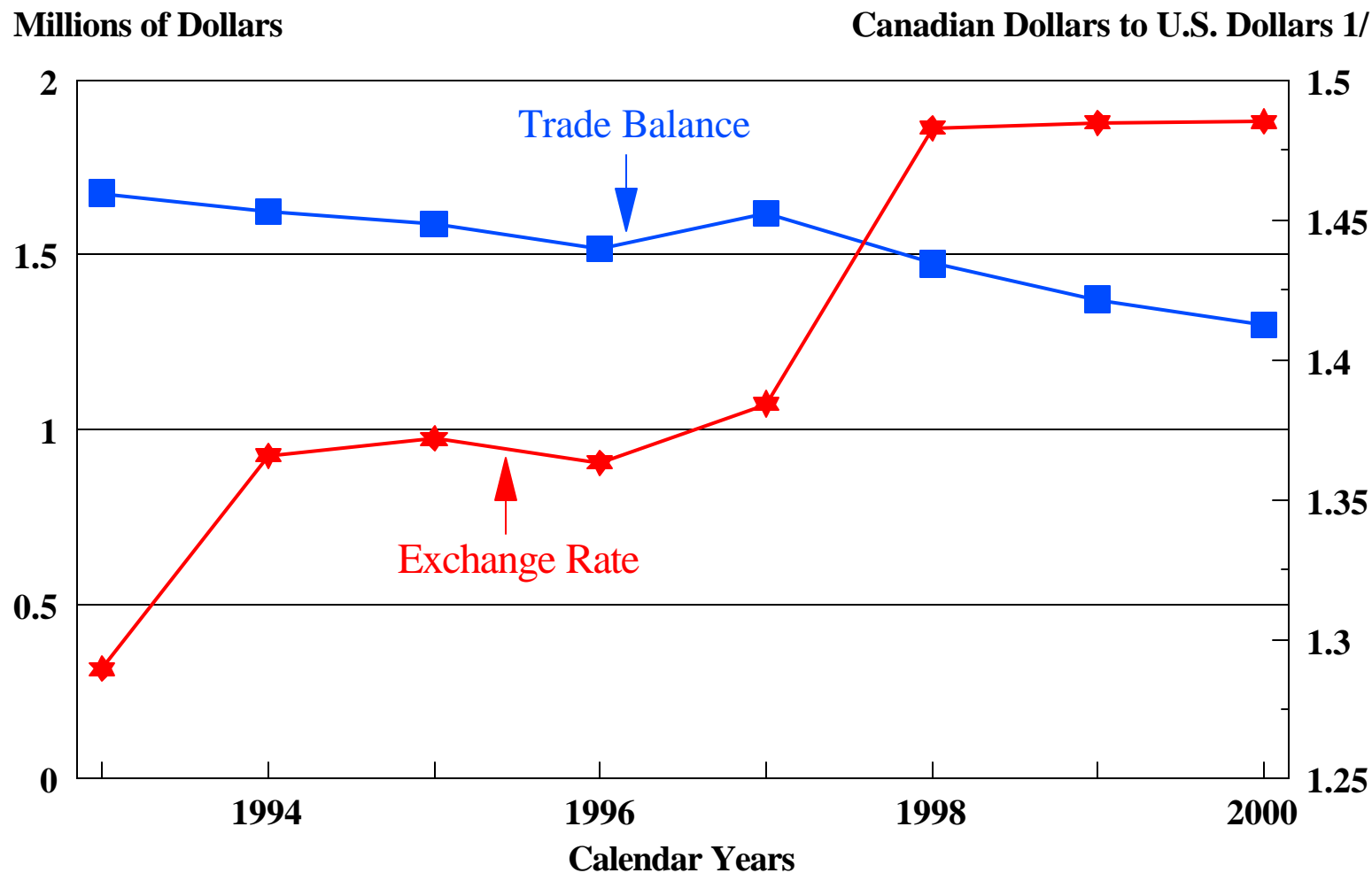
