Report Highlights:

The United States exported \$31.4 million (CIF) or 4,091 metric tons of fresh strawberries to Japan in 2002, a marginal increase from the previous year. Summer Strawberry campaigns in retail stores helped increase sales of fresh U.S. strawberries. In the frozen market, the U.S. exported \$19.4 million (CIF), 9,294 metric tons, of frozen strawberries to Japan in 2002, a decline of 18 percent from the previous year, principally due to competition from lower priced Chinese products.



Fresh U.S. Strawberry Imports Steady



In 2002, Japanese imports of fresh U.S. strawberries increased approximately 1.8 percent to 4,091 metric tons, valued at \$31.4 million (CIF). Japanese retail sales promotions, along with heavy use by the confectionary industry were the principal reasons. U.S. strawberry sales started in May when the supply of domestic strawberries ended and will continue until the new crop of domestic strawberries appear in the market in early December. Although fresh U.S. strawberries are largely consumed by the Japanese confectionery sector (approximately 80

percent of U.S. strawberry imports), mainly in shortcake, consumption at retail stores and in the food service sector is increasing. Japanese traders expect fresh U.S. strawberry imports to reach 4,200 metric tons in 2003.

Ca. Strawberry Commission Created New Summer Strawberry Market


Traditionally, domestic strawberries fill the retail market in winter and spring. This year, as a result of heavy sales promotions by Japanese retailers and the California strawberry industry, summer sales of fresh U.S. strawberries increased significantly at Japan's retail outlets. Japan imported 1,759 metric tons of U.S. strawberries in the 2003 June-August period, up approximately 5.5 percent from the same period last year. Fruit arrived in better condition than in previous years and with better packaging, according to Tokyo traders. Although U.S. strawberries have more acidity than Japanese ones, the acidity actually accentuates the fruity flavor in the hot summer season. Fresh U.S. strawberries have quickly become accepted by Japanese consumers as a table consumption fruit.

Fresh U.S. Strawberry Retail Promotions Appealed to Japanese Consumers

Japanese traders and U.S. suppliers in cooperation with the California Strawberry Commission continue fresh U.S. strawberry sales campaigns, featuring fresh California summer strawberries. Tokyo's major supermarkets demonstrated various breakfasts with fresh summer strawberries, offering sample tasting of California strawberries mixed with yogurt, cereals or salad! "Summer Strawberry" sales promotional girls highlighted the events. U.S. summer strawberry sales campaigns also extended to Japan's food service sector with new menu presentations by Japanese traders. Table place mats printed with dessert menus, featuring fresh California strawberries, attracted customers at Tokyo's family restaurant outlets.

In early October, U.S. strawberries were traded at \$68.33 (7,500 yen), a similar price to last year, for a 5-kilogram case at Tokyo's Ohta Fresh Produce Wholesale Market. U.S. strawberries are pre-packaged in California in retail-size clamshell container and normally sold at \$4.53 (498 yen) for a package of 6 oz (284 grams) in Tokyo supermarkets. During supermarket sales fairs they are often discounted to \$3.62 (398 yen) per pack.

2002 Japanese Imports of U.S. Frozen Strawberries Down 18 Percent



Japan imported 9,294 metric tons of U.S. frozen strawberries in 2002, valued at \$19.4 million (CIF), down approximately 18 percent from the previous year. Taking advantage of low production costs, China continued to increase its shipments to Japan, supplying 13,236 metric tons of frozen strawberries in 2002. Chinese frozen strawberries are often specifically prepared to Japanese industry. Chinese strawberries are Chandler variety, while U.S. ones are Camarosa variety. The average U.S. import price was

\$2.09 per kilogram (CIF) in 2002, reflecting the higher quality products. The average price for Chinese products was \$1.03 per kilogram (CIF). South Korea, Mexico and Chile are also important suppliers of frozen strawberries to the Japanese market. The average import prices were \$1.36, \$1.58 and \$1.31 per kilogram (CIF), respectively.

High Quality U.S. Frozen Strawberry Finds More Users in Food Service

Traditionally, Japan's jam manufacturers are the largest users of U.S. frozen strawberries. Lower priced products from China have pushed the U.S. out of strawberries as a jam ingredient. Despite being almost double the price of Chinese strawberries, higher quality U.S. products are penetrating the Japan hotel and restaurant market. Pastry cooks, chefs and bartenders are increasingly using U.S. frozen strawberries to make desserts, cakes and cocktails.

High Japanese Import Duties are Imposed on Fresh and Frozen Strawberries

These duties are not subject to further reductions outside of the next round of WTO negotiations. The applicable import duties are as follows:
