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Report Highlights:

Discouraged by low price for Robusta, inputs remain low and management practices are less intensive, which has led to declining productivity. Total production is forecast to decline from 6,140 (60 kg bags) tbags in marketing year 2002/03 to 5,700 tbags in 2003/04. As a result of the expected lower domestic supplies, coffee bean exports are forecast to decline about 15 percent in 2003/04.

SECTION I - SITUATION AND OUTLOOK

Production

Due to declining profits, farmers continue to abandon coffee plantations and reduce area planted. As a result, 2002/03 area has been reduced, and the forecast for 2003/04 has been lowered to 950 HA, about 11 percent below that estimated for 2002/03. Harvested area has similarly been lowered accordingly. However, the estimate for overall production in 2002/03 has been increased to reflect the mild weather that occurred during the blooming season, and the resultant higher yields. Due to the unusually long dry season that was prevalent in some coffee producing areas such as East Java, Lampung, North Sumatra and continued inadequate crop maintenance (as a result of farmers' financial difficulties), yields are expected to decline in 2003/04, and total output is forecast to fall to 5,700 tbags.

Consumption and Prices

Domestic coffee consumption remains relatively low, accounting for only about 25 percent of domestic production. In addition, only lower quality coffee is generally held for the domestic market, with the higher qualities destined for export. However, consumption continues to rise, albeit slowly. A more diverse array of locally produced canned, boxed, and bottled coffee beverages are now available in retail outlets, and a number of modern coffee shops have recently opened, helping to boost domestic consumption.

In mid September 2003, prices of arabica coffee prices in the production areas of North Sumatra ranged from Rp. 14,000 to Rp. 15,000/kg, and in Java from Rp. 18,500 to Rp. 18,750/kg. Robusta coffee is sold in Lampung at a bench prices ranging from Rp. 5,200 to Rp. 5,300/kg.

Stocks

Limited by space availability and pressured by the increasing utility costs, stock holding is kept to a minimum. Following the recent coffee export agreement signed by the Indonesian Coffee Exporters association and its Vietnam counterpart, exporters are being encouraged to hold stocks until the average price increase to around US\$ 800/mt. With fairly stable domestic consumption and slower exports expected, stocks are forecast to increase to 211 tbags in 2003/04.

Trade

Based on the pace during the first three-quarters of the years, exports in 2002/03 are estimated at 4,755 tbags, slightly above the previous year. In 2002/03, exports are forecast to decline to 4,039 tbags due to lower domestic supplies and continued fierce competition.

Currently, about 75 percent of Indonesia's coffee production is exported. To improve export performance, all stakeholders (government, industries and farmers) intend to enhance bean quality in accordance with the International Coffee Organization's Resolution No. 407.

To fulfill demand from the rapidly developing coffee beverage sector (coffee shops, hotels, restaurants and boxed/bottled/mixed coffee drinks) Indonesia requires imported beans (green and roasted) to blend with local/other coffee varieties. Vietnam and Brazil are the top suppliers to Indonesia. The average green coffee import price during the first five months of 2003 was recorded at US\$ 912.5/ton compared to US\$ 505.1/ton (cif) in 2002. Roasted coffee was recorded at US\$ 1,369.3/ton compared to US\$ 1,761/ton (cif) in 2002.

Green coffee (combined Arabica and Robusta) export prices increased from an average of 643.7/ton in 2002 to US\$ 810.2/ton during Jan-May, 2003. Roasted bean export prices are also increasing, from an average of US\$ 1,861/ton in 2002 to US\$ 2,318.3/ton during Jan-May, 2003. The average of all grades of Arabica export prices (recorded during October 2002 - April 2003) US\$ 2.02/kg while the average export prices of Robusta during the same period was US\$ 0.81/kg.

Policy, General

Indonesia is an International Coffee Organization member.

Attempts have been made to improve quality and enhance productivity, but to date these efforts have been mostly ineffective.

On June 26, 2003 the Association of Indonesian Coffee Exporters signed a technical agreement with its counterpart from Vietnam (Vicofa) for promoting better prices for coffee (only robusta). The two parties agreed that they will be more selective in choosing higher quality beans for export.
