

From the U.S. Geological Survey — standard methods for sampling ground and surface waters

WHY

As part of its mission to provide the information needed for wise management of the Nation's water resources, the USGS promotes datacollection methods that are scientifically valid and quality assured. Inherent in this mission is the need for accurate, nationally comparable data. These standards were published to document the methods currently used by the USGS to produce the data entered into the National Water Inventory System database.



PURPOSE

 (1) Establish and communicate scientifically sound data-collection methods. (2) Encourage consistent use of field methods in order to produce nationally comparable data.
 (3) Provide sampling methods that, when properly applied, result in accurate data that are reproducible within defined limits of variability.



BENEFITS

A national field manual benefits Federal, State, and local government agencies, educational institutions, and the professional private sector by documenting sampling methodology. Consistency in use of field methods reduces costly duplication of effort and promotes data comparability and quality.
