

Grants Available to Expand Mentoring Programs Part of President's Plan to Recruit and Train One Million New Mentors

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has announced that up to \$50 million in grants is available for <u>"Mentoring Children of Prisoners."</u> This grant competition is an important part of fulfilling President Bush's vision to match more disadvantaged youth with caring mentors. In his <u>2003 State of the Union address</u>, the President proposed a three-year, \$450 million initiative to recruit and train mentors for more than one million disadvantaged youth, with a special emphasis on matching children of prisoners with mentors.

The Department of Education also received \$50 million to work with community and faith-based organizations and other groups to develop, expand, and strengthen school-based mentoring programs for disadvantaged middle school students. It is anticipated that the Department will announce its grant competition later this spring.

As stated by President Bush in his <u>Proclamation</u> declaring January 2004 as National Mentoring Month: "These efforts are an important part of our ongoing work to ensure that every child can realize the great promise of America. Every life has value and potential, and all deserve the opportunity to have a bright future. By supporting the individuals and organizations involved in mentoring and by encouraging more citizens to participate in their good works, we can transform America, one heart and one soul at a time."

President Bush recently met Tenisha Stevens upon arrival in New Orleans to thank her for her 14 years of active volunteer service with the Union Bethel AME Church, including mentoring at-risk grade school students.
