

## National Preparedness Month to be Launched in September

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security, The America Prepared Campaign, the American Red Cross, the National Association of Broadcasters, and the U.S. Department of Education have joined a coalition of more than 50 national organizations to engage Americans in emergency preparedness by launching National Preparedness Month on September 9. The launch event at the U.S. Capitol will be co-chaired by a bi-partisan group of Senators and Representatives. And, all 56 state and territorial governors have pledged to mark National Preparedness Month with local events. National Preparedness Month will provide Americans with a variety of opportunities to get involved, including learning how to prepare for emergencies, offering volunteer opportunities in preparedness efforts, and receiving training on first aid and CPR.

## **President Announces Mentoring Grants for Children of Prisoners**

On August 3, <u>President Bush announced</u> <u>\$45.6 million in grants to faith-based and</u> <u>community organizations to provide</u> <u>mentors to children of prisoners</u>. These grants are part of a three-year \$150 million initiative put forth by President Bush in his <u>2003 State of the Union</u> <u>address to help provide 100,000 new</u> <u>mentors for some of the two million</u> <u>children with one or more parents in</u> <u>prison</u>. Studies show that children who have one or more parents in jail are 70 percent more likely to end up in jail themselves.

The grants, administered through the Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Children and Families, will provide 33,000 additional children of prisoners with mentoring support. Local programs that receive Federal funds ensure that volunteer mentors are screened, trained, supported, and monitored, and pair them with children in need. <u>Click here</u> to search the list of grant recipients and contact them to learn how you can volunteer to make a positive impact on a young person's life.



"Imagine what a tough life it is for a young boy or girl to go see his or her mom or dad behind prison bars. These are children who need help. They're vulnerable to gangs and crime and despair. They're desperate for responsible adults in their life who can give them what many of them long for, which is love and tenderness. The best way to do that is to encourage all groups, including faith-based groups, to provide mentors."

\* One Day's Pay is bringing together nonprofit service organizations, private businesses, and groups representing the families of victims of September 11 to help mobilize Americans to serve others. Their goal is to make September 11 a national day of volunteer service, charity, and compassion. In 2003, the initiative drew an estimated one million people; they hope to double it this year. This year's National Neighborhood Day, which falls on September 12, is expected to engage one million people in 25,000 neighborhoods acros s America.
