What this *Reference Guide* is:

The following reference materials have been developed for use by river managers and others in studying, planning and managing potential and designated wild and scenic rivers. The *Wild and Scenic Rivers Reference Guide (Reference Guide)* was developed by the Interagency Wild and Scenic Rivers Coordinating Council (Council). The purpose of the *Reference Guide* is to improve interagency coordination and increase consistency in the interpretation and application of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act. The contents includes information about the Council, the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act and System, and technical papers developed through the Council. Extensive peer review and the contribution of many river managers have greatly enhanced the content of these papers.

What this *Reference Guide* is not:

Importantly, nothing in the *Reference Guide* modifies or replaces any agency's policy, nor the *Department of Interior and Agriculture Interagency Guidelines for Eligibility, Classification and Management of River Areas*. The Council is not a decision-making body. Any revision or creation of agency direction must occur through each agency's respective processes. This *Reference Guide* is not intended to replace coordination within each agency.
